Following report was, on motion, adopted:

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Barron County, Wis.:

GENTLEMEN:—Your special committee to whom was referred the petition of Nick Collas and others asking for the division of the town of Oak Grove, in said county, and for the organization of a new town composed of the territory sought to be detached therefrom, begs leave to report as follows:

That we have carefully examined said petition and find that more than one-third of the legal voters of said town have attached their names thereto; and that the certificate of John Kennedy, clerk of said town of Oak Grove, that the proposition of such division was duly submitted to the electors of said town on the 2nd day of April, 1901, due notice of which had been previously given, as required by law, as appears from the certificate of John Lejeune, the chairman of said town; that the voters residing in each of said proposed subdivisions voted separately, by ballot, in due form upon said question; that the total vote cast by residents of township 36, range 11, west, was 104, sixty-eight (68) for and twenty-six (26) against, and in township 36, range 12, west, the total vote was 45, of which number 36 were for and 9 against.

Your committee further reports that, in their opinion, all the essential requirements of law have been complied with, and it is to the best interests of said respective subdivisions of said town that the prayer of said petitioners be granted, and we recommend that an ordinance be passed by the board detaching township thirty-six (36) north of range twelve (12) west, and when said territory so detached be organized and formed into a new town to be named and known as the town of Bear Lake.

The following ordinance was now adopted by aye and nay vote—ayes 34, noes 0.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Barron do ordain as follows:

That the town of Oak Grove shall be and is hereby divided as follows: All the territory comprising township thirty-six (36), range twelve (12), west, is hereby organized and constituted a new town to be named and known as the town of Bear Lake; that the first town meeting of said town of Bear Lake shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at the school house in school district No. 3, commonly known as the French school house.

That the territory comprising township thirty-six (36), range eleven (11) west, in Barron county be, and the same is hereby organized and constituted a town to be known as the town of Oak Grove; that the first town meeting of said town shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at the public hall in the village of Haugen, in said township as constituted.

That all the records and papers belonging or pertaining to the town of Oak Grove, as now constituted, shall be at the time of the taking effect of this ordinance, be and remain the property of the town of Oak Grove as hereby created, and that such records and papers which are at that time in the lawful custody of the officers residing in such township, remain in their possession and be delivered to their successors in office.

It is further ordained, that the indebtedness of the town of Oak Grove, if any, shall be divided between the towns created by this ordinance, according to the assessed valuation of said towns for the year of 1901, and all property and credits be divided between such towns upon the same basis.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the first Tuesday in April, 1902, at 10 o'clock p. m. of that day.

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Barron County, Wis.

GENTLEMEN:—Your special committee to whom was referred the petition of William Robinson and one hundred and fifty others asking for the division of the town of Cumberland, in said county, and the organization of a new town composed of the territory sought to be detached therefrom, begs leave to make the following report:

That we have carefully examined said petition and find that more than one-third of the legal voters of said town, viz: 151 petitioners out of 360 legal voters, have attached their names to said petition and that the certificate of Gust. Hafslund, town clerk of said town of Cumberland, that the proposition for such division was duly submitted to the electors of said town at the last spring election in said town of Cumberland, due notice of which had been previously given as required by law; that the voters residing in each proposed sub-division voted separately by ballot in due form upon said question; that the total vote cast by residents of township 36, range 14 and 36, range 13 was 112, of which number 106 were in favor of division and 6 against, and that the number of votes cast by residents of township (south half) 35, range 13 and township 35, range 14, was 58, of which number 40 were in favor of such division and 18 against.

Your committee further reports that in their opinion there has been a compliance with the requirements of the law relative to the division of towns and that it is for the best interests of said territory and the residents thereof, that the prayer of the petitioners be granted and we recommend that an ordinance be passed by this board detaching township 36, range 13 west and township 36, range 14 west from said town of Cumberland and that the territory so detached be organized and formed into a new town to be named and known as the town of Lakeland.

That the territory comprising the south half of township 35, range 13 west, and all of township 35, range 14 west, in Barron county, be and the same is hereby organized and constituted a town to be known as the town of Cumberland; that the first town meeting of said town shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at the town hall in said town.

That all the records and papers belonging or pertaining to the town of Cumberland as now constituted shall at the time of the taking effect of this ordinance, be and remain the property of the town of Cumberland as hereby created, and that such records and papers which are at that time in the lawful custody of officers residing in townships south half of 35, range 13 west, and 35, 14 west, shall remain in their possession and be delivered to their successors in office.

It is further ordained that the indebtedness of the said town of Cumberland, if any, shall be assumed and borne by the said towns according to the assessed valuations of the said towns of Cumberland and Lakeland for the year of 1901.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at 10 o'clock p. m. of that day.

Special Meeting of County Board of Supervisors. . . .

The County Board of Supervisors, met at the Court House in the city of Barron, Wis., at two o'clock p. m. Feb. 18th 1902 in Special Session, pursuant to the call made by the County Clerk at the request of a majority of the Board on file in the County Clerk's office, and was called to order by the chairman, Mr. Andrew Gulickson.

County Clerk S. W. Sparlin and Assistant Clerk F. B. Kinsley present.

Roll of members called and all answered present except Supt. G. E. Scott of the Village of Prairie Farm.

The Clerk read the request for this Special meeting signed by 28 members, and the call therefor issued by the County Clerk thereon.

The following resolutions were adopted—Ayes 33, Noes 0.

By Supervisor And. Stoll.—

Resolved that the Ordinance adopted at the annual meeting of the County Board of Supervisors Nov. 1901, dividing the town of Cumberland and creating the towns of Lakeland and Cumberland, be amended so that when so amended it shall read as follows:

The County Board of Supervisors of the county of Barron do ordain as follows:

That the town of Cumberland shall be and is hereby divided as follows: All the territory comprising townships 36 north of ranges 13 and 14 west is hereby organized and constituted as a new town to be named and known as the town of Lakeland; and that the first town meeting of said

town of Lakeland shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at the residence of W. L. Hunter, located on the sw ¼ of the sw ¼, of section 32, in town 36, north of range 13 west. That the territory comprising township 35 range 13 west except the territory comprising the City of Cumberland, and all of the township 35, range 14 west, in Barron County, be and the same is hereby organized and constituted a town to be known as the town of Cumberland; that the first town meeting of said town shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at the town hall in said town.

That all the records and papers belonging or pertaining to the town of Cumberland as now constituted shall at the time of the taking effect of this ordinance, be and remain the property of the town of Cumberland as hereby created, and that such records and papers which are at that time in the lawful custody of officers residing in townships 35, range 13 west, and 35, 14 west, shall remain in their possession and be delivered to their successors in office.

It is further ordained that the indebtedness of the said town of Cumberland, if any, shall be assumed and borne by the said towns according to the assessed valuations of the said towns of Cumberland and Lakeland for the year of 1901.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the first Tuesday of April, 1902, at 10 o'clock p. m. of that day.

Report of committee on town organization and division town of Cumberland adopted and the following ordinance adopted by ayes and no votes. Ayes 34, Noes 0.

To the Honorable the County Board of Supervisors of Barron county, Wisconsin. Gentlemen:—Your special committee to whom was referred the petition of J. Patterson and one hundred and fifty-one others asking for the division of the town of Cumberland, in said county and the organization of a new town composed of the territory sought to be detached therefrom, begs leave to make the following report:

That we have carefully examined said petition and find that more than one-third of the legal voters of said town, viz: 152 petitioners out of 300 legal voters have attached their names to said petition and that the certificate of Gust Hafslund, town clerk of said town of Cumberland, that the proposition for such division was duly submitted to the electors of said town at the last spring election in said town

of Cumberland, due notice of which had been perviously given as required by law; that the voters residing in each proposed subdivision voted separately by ballot in due form upon said question; that the total vote cast by residents of township 35, range 13 west was 200, of which number 125 were in favor of division and 75 against and that the total number of votes cast by residents of township 35 range 14 west was 100 of which number 53 were in favor of such division and 47 against.

Your committee further reports that in their opinion there has been a compliance with the requirements of the law relative to the division of towns and that it is for the best interest of said territory and the residents thereof, that the prayer of the petitioners be granted and we recommend that an ordinance be passed by this board detaching township 35 range 14 west from said town of Cumberland and that the territory so detached be organized and formed into a new town to be named and known as the town of Crystal Lake.

It is further ordained that the indebtedness of the said town of Cumberland, if any shall be assumed and borne by the said towns according to the assessed valuations of the said towns of Cumberland and Crystal Lake for the year of 1902.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the first Tuesday of April, 1903, at 10 o'clock p. m. of that day.
