Proceedings of the County Board of Supervisors.

BAYFIELD, Wis., January 28, 1884.

A special meeting of the county board was held in the office of the county clerk this 28th day of January, 1884, pursuant to call.

All members present. Meeting called to order by the chairman.

The following bills were presented and ordered paid:

The board then proceeded to the setting off and organization of towns in this county.

Supervisor Fischer introduced the following ordinances each of which were unanimously adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 1.

The county board of supervisors of Bayfield county do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Township forty-three north, of ranges five, six, seven and eight west, and townships forty-four and forty-five north, of ranges seven and eight west are hereby detached from the town of Bayfield, and the territory so detached, comprising eight townships, shall constitute and is hereby organized into a separate town to be known and designated as the town of Drummond.

SECTION 2. The first town meeting of said town of Drummond shall be held on the first Tuesday of April next at the store of the Rust Owen Lumber Company in the village of Drummond.

SECTION 3. Upon the election and qualification of its town officers, the town of Drummond as described in section one of this ordinance, shall be fully organized with all the rights, powers and privileges by law granted to, conferred upon or possessed by other towns in this state.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Adopted January 28, 1884.

ORDINANCE NO. 2.

The county board of supervisors of Bayfield do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Townships forty-four and forty-five north of ranges five and six west, and township forty-six north of ranges five, six, seven and eight west are hereby detached from the town of Bayfield, and the territory so detached, comprising eight townships shall constitute and is hereby organized into a separate town to be known and designated as the town of Mason.

SECTION 2. The first town meeting of said town of Mason shall be held at the White River Lumber Company's store in the village of Mason on the first Tuesday of April next.

SECTION 3. Upon the election and qualification of its town officers, the town of Mason as described in section one (1) of this ordinance shall be fully organized with all the rights, powers and privileges by law granted to, conferred upon or possessed by other towns in the state.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Adopted January 28, 1884.

ORDINANCE NO. 3.

The county board of supervisors of Bayfield county do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Township forty-seven north, of ranges five, six and seven west, township forty-eight north of ranges six and seven west, fractional township forty-eight north of range five west, fractional township forty-eight north, of range four west and the south one half of township forty-nine north of ranges five, six and seven west together with all that part of fractional township forty-nine north, of range four west lying south of a line beginning at the north west corner of section 19 of said township and running thence east on the section line to the point at which said line intersects the eastern boundary line of range four west in Chequamegon bay, are hereby detached from the town of Bayfield, and the territory so detached shall constitute and is hereby organized into a separate town to be known and designated as the town of Washburn.

SECTION 2. The first town meeting of said town of Washburn shall be held at hotel Washburn in the village of Washburn on the first Tuesday of April next.

SECTION 3. Upon the election and qualification of its town officers, the town of Washburn shall be fully organized with all the rights, powers and privileges by law granted to, conferred upon or possessed by other towns in this state.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Adopted January 28, 1884.

ORDINANCE NO. 4.

The county board of supervisors of Bayfield county do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. All the territory of the county of Bayfield not embraced in the foregoing towns shall remain and shall be known and designated as the town of Bayfield, and said town of Bayfield shall continue to exercise all the functions, and be clothed with all the rights, powers and privileges of other towns in the state the same as heretofore.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Adopted January 28, 1884.

Each of the above ordinances were unanimously adopted all members voting for their adoption.

Moved by supervisor Boutin that the County Clerk make a plat of each of the towns above named and a record thereof specifying the name and boundaries of each of said towns. Motion seconded by Supervisor Fischer. Carried, all members voting in the affirmative.

Minutes read and approved.

Board adjourned until the regular meeting, Feb. 4, 1884.
