The following ordinance was on motion of Supervisor Van Gorden adopted on call of the ayes <sup>and</sup> noes as follows:  
 Supervisors Bremer, Boek, Cole, Cheney, Dunn, Huggitt, Hunter, Heggen, Hancock, Mills, Peterson, Spaulding, Thompson, Thomas, Torkelson, Van Gorden, Vincent, Withe, <sup>and</sup> Whitney, voting Aye. Total 19.

Whereas: It appears from the certificate of the Town Clerk of the town of Hixton filed in the office of the county clerk on the fifth day of April A.D. 1889 that upon the petition of over one hundred freeholders of said town, said petition being over one third of the legal voters of said town <sup>and</sup> after due notice given as required by Statute, the voters in said town decided to divide the same, upon the subdivision line between Ranges five <sup>and</sup> six Town 22 North Section 36 Town 23 Range 6, now a part of the town of Hixton, to be included in the West half of said sub-division.

Therefore the County Board of Supervisors of the county of Jackson do ordain as follows:

First. That all of Township N<sup>o</sup>. 22 Range 6 West, including Section thirty six of Township 23 Range 6 be <sup>and</sup> the same is hereby detached <sup>and</sup> set off from the town of Hixton <sup>and</sup> that

said territory above described, be organized and formed into a new town to be designated as the town of Curran.

Second. That the first town meeting in said town of Curran be held on the first Tuesday in April A.D. 1890 at the School House known as the Curran School House in said town.

Third - That said new town of Curran shall bear and pay its proportional share of all debts and liabilities of said town of Hixton as the same shall stand against said town on the first Tuesday of April A.D. 1890.

Fourth - That said provisions of this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after the first day of April A.D. 1890
