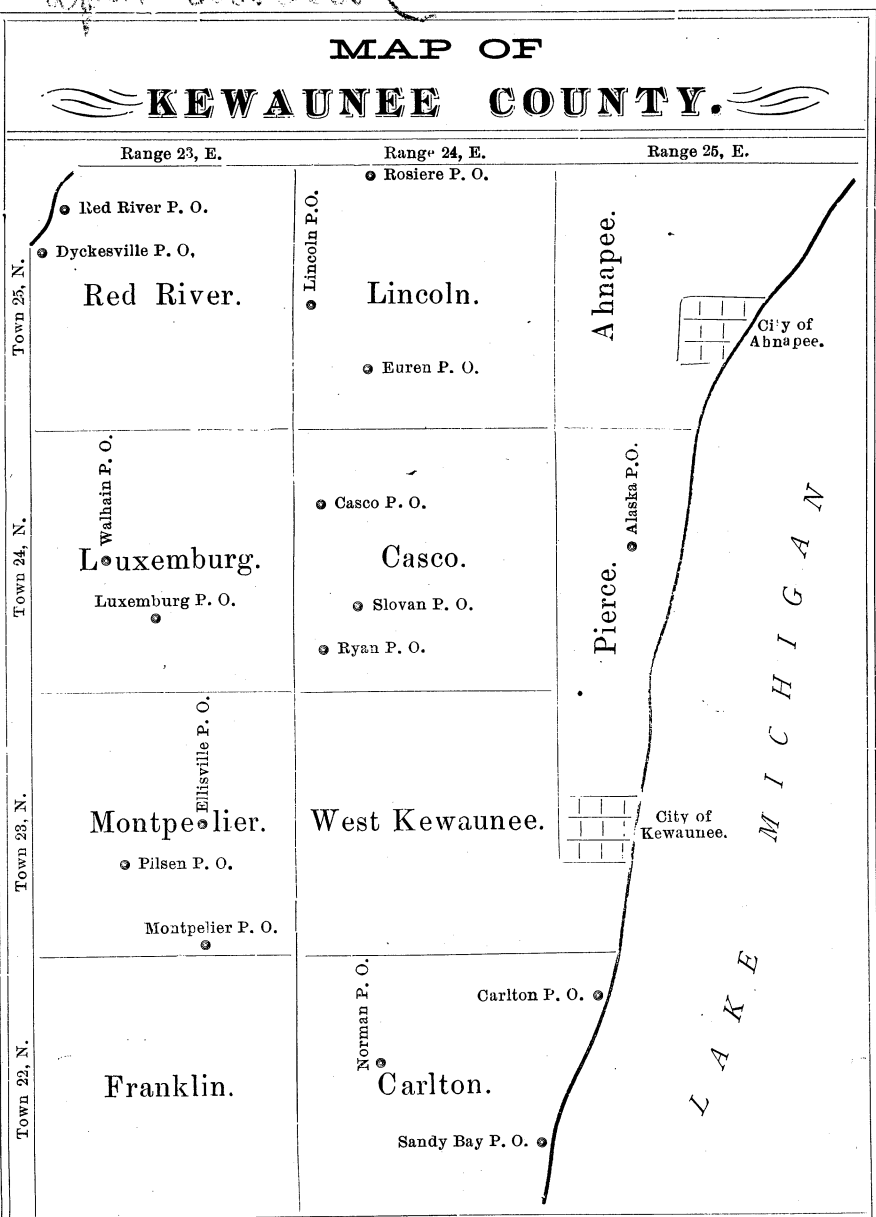

It has first-class mail facilities by daily stages from Green Bay and Two Rivers and during the season of navigation is one of the leading stopping points for all steamers plying between Chicago and Green Bay ports. Pursuant to Section 709, Subdivision 12, R. S. I herewith submit you statement of changing boundaries and names of Towns in above said County by the County Board of Supervisors, at a meeting held by said Board, on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> days of March 1883 as follows:

Sections number six (6) seven (7) eighteen (18) Nineteen (19) Thirty (30) and Thirty one (31) of Township Twenty-four (24) north of Range Twenty-four (24) east were detached from the Town of "Cases" and attached to the Town of "Pierce" and the name of said Town of "Cases" consisting of Township Twenty-four (24) north of Range Twenty-three (23) East was then changed to "Ludenburg".

All of Township Twenty-four (24) north of Range Twenty-five (25) east was detached from the Town of Pierce and attached to the Town of Kenosha.

All that territory comprised in Township Twenty-four (24) north of Range Twenty-four (24) was then named "Cases".

All of Township Twenty-four (24) north of Range Twenty-five (25) east and all of Township Twenty-three (23) north of Range Twenty-five (25) east lying north of the north boundary line of the Village of Kenosha shall form the Town of Kenosha which name was then changed to "Pierce".

All of Township Twenty-three (23) north of Range Twenty-five (25) lying south of the south boundary line of the Village of Kenosha was detached from the Town of Kenosha and attached to the Town of West Kenosha.
