An Ordinance to divide the Town of Langlade, and to create the Town of Ainsworth, in Langlade County, Wis.

WHEREAS, The Town of Langlade, in Langlade County and State of Wisconsin, comprises four (4) Townships and it seems to be to the interest of the taxpayers and the convenience of the residents of said Town to divide said territory into more suitable proportions, as appears by the petition duly signed by the residents of said Town, heretofore presented to this Board and the question afterwards duly presented to the vote of the electors of said Town of Langlade and at an annual Town election held on the 5th day of April, 1904 and by said electors duly carried in favor of said division,

THEREFOR, The Board of Supervisors of the County of Langlade do ordain as follows:

First: That there is hereby detached from the Town of Langlade, in Langlade County, and State of Wisconsin, two Townships or seventy-two (72) Sections thereof, being all of that territory comprised in Township Thirty-three (33) and Thirty-four (34), North of Range No. ~~##~~ Twelve (12), East, which said detached territory is hereby set apart and designated as a Town of said Langlade County, which shall be known by the corporate name of the Town of Ainsworth.

That said Town of Ainsworth shall organize and go into effect at the next general Town meeting held after the passage of this ordinance. The voting precinct thereof shall be at the house of F.W.Hoffman in said Town of Ainsworth. That a Committee of three members of the County Board, namely G.S.Dempster, Christ Wunderlich and Willard Lloyd are hereby appointed to make a settlement between the Town of Langlade and said Town of Ainsworth and apportion the indebtedness between said Towns in accordance with law and report such settlement to this Board at its next meeting and file copies of such report with said Towns of Langlade and Ainsworth.

That the County Clerk shall make a correct plat of said Town of Ainsworth and file the same in his office, specifying the name and boundaries of said Town of Ainsworth, as made by this ordinance.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

That the County Clerk shall make a correct plat of said town of Ainsworth and file the same in his office, specifying the name and boundaries of said town of Ainsworth, as made by this ordinance.
