Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read.

ORDINANCE

Whereas thirty or more free holders, residents of the town of King in Lincoln county, Wisconsin, being at least one-third of the legal voters of said town, did, at the last annual meeting of the county board of supervisors of said county, petition said county board for a division of said town by detaching therefrom township number thirty-four (34) north of range number seven (7) east and that such detached territory be organized into a town to be known as "Town of Skanawan," and,

Whereas said petitioners did thereafter and at least twenty days before the next annual town meeting to-wit; the annual town meeting held in April, 1910, file a copy of said petition with the clerk of said town and said clerk did, at least ten days before said town meeting give notice that the question of said division of said town would be voted on at said town meeting by posting notices thereof, showing the manner in which it was proposed to divide said town, in four public places in each proposed sub-division thereof, and

Whereas the voters residing in each as said proposed sub-divisions voted separately by ballot, those in favor of the division voting a ballot containing the words "for division" and, those against the division voting a ballot containing "against division" and,

Whereas a majority of the votes cast in said territory proposed to be detached were in favor of said division and the town clerk has certified that fact to the county clerk of said county,

Now therefore, the county board of supervisors of the county of Lincoln do ordain as follows:

That the town of King in said county be and the same is hereby divided by detaching therefrom the following described terri-

tory, to-wit: All of township thirty-four (34) north of range seven (7) east.

That there is hereby formed and created out of said detached territory a new town which shall be called and is hereby named "Town of Skanawan."

That the first town meeting in said town of Skanawan shall be held on the first Tuesday in April, 1911, at the school house in said town, located on SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec 29 in township 34, north of range 7 east and that a joint meeting of the town boards of said towns of King and Skanawan be held at such place on the Tuesday following said annual town meeting for the purpose of determining the matters provided for in section 672 of the Wisconsin statutes as amended.

That the county clerk of said county cause this ordinance to be published in the official county newspaper, to-wit: THE MERRILL DAILY HERALD and distribute and file copies of the newspaper containing such publication in accordance with the requirements of section 674 of the Wisconsin statutes.
