The said petitioners having appeared by Barnes & Page their attorneys, and no person having appeared against such application and after hearing the allegations and proofs and examining the papers on file and considering the same the Court being satisfied.

1. That the survey and census annexed to said petition are correct
2. That all the requirements of the statutes have been complied with by said petitioners.
3. That the territory sought to be incorporated as a village by the name of Walworth, is described as follows:-

Beginning at the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21) township number one (1) North, range sixteen (16) East, thence East on the North section line of sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-two (22) town and range aforesaid, thence South on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) section line of said section, one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of said section twenty-two (22), thence West on the South section line of said sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21), thence

North on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) line of said section, one mile, to the place of beginning, being all in town Number one (1) North, range sixteen (16) East; and the quantity of land therein embraced is 640 acres.

4. That such territory at the time said census was taken contained the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein, required in section 854 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED; that said territory bounded and described as follows:- Beginning at the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21) township number one (1) North, range sixteen (16) East, thence east on the North section line of sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-two (22) town and range aforesaid, thence South on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) section line of said section, one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of said section twenty-two (22), thence West on the South section line of said sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21), thence North on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) line of said section, one mile, to the place of beginning, being all in town Number one(1) North, range sixteen (16) East; and the quantity of land therein embraced is 640 acres, shall be incorporated as a village by the name of Walworth. If the electors thereof shall assent thereto, as provided by law.

IT IS FURTHER, ORDERED; That MR. Le. S. Dauglass,

residents of the town of Walworth, in which such territory is situated be, and are hereby directed to perform the duties of inspectors of the election as provided in chapter 40 of the Wisconsin statutes of 1898, to determine whether the electors of such territory assent to the incorporation of said territory as a village.

that they presided at and duly qualified and acted as inspectors of election of the meeting of the electors, of the following described territory situated in the County of Walworth, State of Wisconsin, to wit:- Beginning at the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21) township number one (1) North, range sixteen (16) East, thence East on the North section line of sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the North quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-two (22) town and range aforesaid, thence South on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) section line of said section, one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of said section twenty-two (22), thence West on the South section line of said sections twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22), one mile, to the South quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post of section twenty-one (21), thence North on the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) line of said section, one mile, to the place of beginning, being all in town Number one (1) North, range sixteen (16) East; and the quantity of land therein embraced is 640 acres, held pursuant to the order of the Circuit Court in the above entitled matter, made on the 18th. day of February A. D. 1901, and notice duly given held at the Town Hall within said territory on the 20th. day of March A. D. 1901, held for the purpose of determining whether or not said territory shall be an incorporated Village; that said meeting of the election of said territory was duly held, that none but qualified electors residents within said territory were allowed to vote; that said electors voted by ballot having thereon the word "yes" or the word "no"; that the whole number of ballots given at such meeting was eighty-five (85) of

which ballots Seventy-nine (79) had thereon the word "yes", and six had thereon the word "no"; and that the said election and meeting of the electors of said territory for the purpose of determining whether or not said territory shall be an incorporated Village resulted in favor of the incorporation of such Village.
