V. That such territory as ought to be and is included as aforesaid, contained at the time such census was taken, the population in number and proportion and the quantity of land therein required in and by Section 854 of the Revised Statutes of this State for the year 1898, and Acts Amendatory.

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ORDERED that such territory, being a part of Sections Twenty-one (21) and Twenty-eight (28), in Township Fourteen (14), North of Range Seven (7) West, which is particularly designated and bounded by commencing at the Section corner of the four Sections ^{21 22} in Township Fourteen (14), North of Range Seven (7) ^{28 27} West, and running West on Section line between Sections 21 and 28, - Eighty (80) rods; thence North Eighty (80) rods into Section 21; thence running West Eighty (80) rods to North and South quarter line in Section 21; thence still West Eighty (80) rods to government corner in swamp; thence running South Two Hundred and Forty (240) rods to the South West corner of the South East quarter of the North West quarter of said Section 28; thence running East on quarter line Forty-eight (48) rods; thence South Forty (40) degrees Thirty (30) min. West, 64 03/100 rods to an iron rod set in the ground by a gate post; thence running due East Eighty-three (83) rods and Seven (7) links; thence running North Forty (40) rods to quarter line; thence East along quarter line 120 rods to government corner in Coon River; thence North along the East line of said Section 28, 160 rods to the place of beginning, containing Three Hundred Forty-two (342) Acres and Thirty (30) rods of land, shall be incorporated as a Village by the name of The Village of Stoddard, if the electors thereof shall assent thereto as provided by law.
