In the matter of the Incorporation

of the Village of Stockbridge.

At a General Term of the Circuit Court, held in and for the County of Winnebago, Wisconsin, commencing the second Monday in April, 1908, the same being a special term for the county of Calumet, in the same circuit, and on the 6th day of June, 1908, and in said term, the following proceedings were had.

Present and presiding, Hon. Geo. W. Burnell, Circuit Judge.

On application of Wm. Parsons, John Flatley, John Moehn, Henry Bast, Wm. Bovee, Frank Stahl, Joseph Bast, Arthur Hatch and Louis Hatch, residents of the town of Stockbridge, Calumet County, Wisconsin, residing upon the hereinafter described territory, by verified petition and proceedings had under sections 854 to 869 of the Wisconsin Statute of 1898, and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, for an order that certain territory therein described be incorporated as a village, that said petitioners having appeared by E. W. Paulsen, their counsel, and no residents or taxpayers of said territory having appeared against such application, after hearing the allegations and proofs and considering the same, the court being satisfied of the facts and so finds,

1st,- That the survey and map of the territory within the limits of such village annexed to said petition is an accurate survey and map of the territory, showing the courses and distances of the boundaries and the quantity of land contained therein;

2nd,- That the accuracy of said map and survey is duly verified by the affidavit of Elmer Thurston, a practical surveyor, annexed thereto, the surveyor who made such survey and map;

3rd,- That the census attached to such petition is an accurate census of the resident population of such territory as it was on the 15th and 16th days of April, 1908, not more than ^{ten} ~~three~~ weeks before the making of this application, exhibiting the name of every head of a family and the name of every person a resident in good faith of ^{such} ~~said~~ territory on said days, and the lot of land on which he resides, duly verified by the

affidavit of Floyd Greeley, the person ^d taking such census affixed thereto;

4th,~~th~~ That the territory proposed to be incorporated into a village by the name of " Stockbridge ", is a part of the town of Stockbridge, Calumet County, Wisconsin, and all situated in townships Eighteen (18) and Nineteen (19) north of range Eighteen (18) east of the 4th P. M. in said county, not less than one-half (1/2) square mile, - 1448.50-acres, in area, and not included in any village, all lying in the same county, and containing a resident population of not less than three hundred - three hundred thirty three (333)-, persons therein;

5th,- That the said survey, map and census together with the verifications, were left in the store building Joseph Bast, who resides and has his said store and place of business within such territory, on the 24th day of April, 1908, and there kept subject to examination at all reasonable hours by every person interested until June 3rd, 1908, for a period of ~~two~~ five weeks and more from the posting of the notices of the application hereinbefore found;

6th,- That there is no newspaper printed within the territory proposed to be incorporated and hereinafter described;

7th,- That the applicants gave notice that they would apply to the Circuit Court of Calumet County, Wisconsin, the County ~~with~~in which the territory lies on the 23rd day of April, 1908, being the date of said notice for an order incorporating such territory as a village by the name of Stockbridge, the name therein specified, which notices were written or printed with a type-writer, and described the boundaries of such territory by courses and distances, and specified the town in which it lies;

8th,- That said notices were posted in at least three, and six, of the most public places in such territory on the 24th day of April, 1908, at least six weeks before the time so specified in such notice for the making of this application;

9th,- That the petition, map and survey, verification, census, verification, proof of the leaving the same for examination by persons interested, notice of application to court, and proof of the posting of the same and all other necessary papers and affidavits have been filed as well have all the requirements of the statutes been complied with by the petitioners

10th,- That the said territory is not by government survey surveyed

into, nor is it laid out in section or quarter sections, but that the same has been surveyed and laid out into "Lots" so designated under government survey;

Now on motion of E. W. Paulsen, counsel for the said petitioners,-

It Is Therefore Ordered, That such territory bounded and described in the petition, map and survey, census and notices as follows;-

Commencing on the shore of Lake Winnebago at the south west corner of lot number Twenty seven (27) in the Stockbridge Indian Reservation, now called and known as "Town of Stockbridge", in Calumet County, State of Wisconsin, running thence south eighty nine (89) degrees fifty five (55) minutes east, on and along the south line of lots number Twenty seven (27),- Eighty (80),- and One hundred thirty three (133),- of said town of Stockbridge, to the south east corner of said lot One hundred thirty three (133), one hundred fifty eight and five hundredths (158.05) chains, thence north twenty (20) minutes west on and along the east line of lots number One hundred thirty three (133),- One hundred thirty two (132),- One hundred thirty one (131),- One hundred thirty (130),- One hundred twenty nine (129),- One hundred twenty eight (128),- and One hundred twenty seven (127),- of said town of Stockbridge, eighty eight and eighty six hundredths (88.86) chains, to the north east corner of said lot number One hundred twenty seven (127),- thence south eighty nine degrees $\frac{5}{4}$ fifty minutes (89° 50') west on and along the north line of lot number One hundred twenty seven (127),- of said town of Stockbridge to the north west corner of said lot One hundred twenty seven (127) fifty and sixteen hundredths (50.16) chains, thence due west on and along the north line of lots number Eighty six (86) and Twenty one (21) of said town of Stockbridge one hundred twenty and fifty four ^{hundredths} (120.54) chains, to the north west corner of said lot number Twenty one (21), at and on the shore of ^{said} lake Winnebago, thence southerly along and meandering the shore of said lake Winnebago to the south west corner of said lot number Twenty seven (27), the place of beginning; said boundaries embracing all of lots number Twenty one (21),- Twenty two (22),- Twenty three (23),- Twenty four (24),- Twenty five (25),- Twenty six (26),- Twenty seven (27),-

Eighty (80),- Eighty one (81),- Eighty two (82),- Eighty three (83),-
Eighty four (84),- Eighty five (85),- Eighty six (86),- One hundred twenty
seven (127),- One hundred twenty eight (128),- One hundred twenty nine
(129),- One hundred thirty (130),- One hundred thirty one (131),- One
hundred thirty two (132),-^{and} One hundred thirty three (133) of the said
Stockbridge Indian Reservation, being said Town of Stockbridge, as afore-
said, in Calumet County, State of Wisconsin, and situated in Townships
Eighteen (18) and Nineteen (19) north of range Eighteen (18) east of the
4th P. M. in said county, containing therein Fourteen hundred forty
eight and fifty one-hundredths (1448.50) acres in area, shall be incor-
porated as a village, by the name of "Stockbridge", if the electors
thereof shall assent thereto as provided by law.

It Is Further Ordered, That David Allen, George W. Howe, and
William Bovee, resident electors of the town of Stockbridge, said ^{County} ~~town~~
and state, in which ~~said~~ such territory is situated, be, and they are
hereby directed to perform the duties of inspectors of election as pro-
vided by chapter 40 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1898, and all acts
amendatory ^{thereof} and supplemental thereto, to ~~the~~ determine whether the electors
of said territory assent to the incorporation thereof as a village.

electors so residing within ~~said~~^{such} territory voted by ballot having thereon the word "Yes" and the word "No"; that at such meeting or election the polls were opened at ten o'clock in the forenoon of that day and kept open until four o'clock in the afternoon, except that the inspectors closed the polls at twelve o'clock noon, for one hour, of all of which due notice was given; that after the closing of the polls of said election, and upon canvass of the ballots given at such election being made by them, it was found, ascertained and determined that said election resulted in favor of the incorporation of said village; that thereupon affiants as such inspectors made the statement of such election required by section 865, Wis. Statutes of 1898, as amended, duly verified by the affidavit of said inspectors written thereon, and thereupon and on the 30th day of June, 1908, affiants caused said petition and all of the accompanying papers, and all such^{as} had been added under the direction of said court, the order of the court for incorporation and the said statement and affidavit of the inspectors to be recorded at length by the Register of Deeds in the office of ~~the~~ Register of Deeds in and for Calumet County, Wisconsin, within ten days after such election as required by section 866 Wis. Statutes of 1898.
