In the Matter of the Application of
Jacob Schultz, S. A. Fleming, Joseph Taylor,
V. Brownlee, W. E. Tucker, and C. A. Hager *+ R. H. Dodge*
for an Order Incorporating the Village
of Bay City.

At a Special term of the circuit court in
and for Pierce County, Wisconsin, begun and
held at the Court House in the City of Durand,
Pepin County, Wisconsin on the 18th day of
October, A. D. 1909, and on the first day
of said Term, Present and Presiding, the
Hon. E. W. Helms, Circuit Judge.

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This matter having come on to be heard on the application of
Jacob Schultz, S. A. Fleming, Joseph Taylor, V. Brownlee, W. E. T
Tucker, and C. A. Hager *+ R. H. Dodge* for an Order incorporating the Village
of Bay City out of the territory hereinafter described, and the
court having heard all the parties interested, and it duly appearing
to the satisfaction of the court that all of the territory
hereinafter described is situate wholly within the town of Isabelle,
Pierce County, Wisconsin, and that the quantity of land therein
embraced is three hundred and twenty three and sixty-four one
hundredths acres, and that the petitioners are each and all
citizens and tax payers of said territory; that on or about the
19th day of August, A. D. 1909, the said petitioners caused an
accurate survey and map of said territory hereinafter described
to be made by a competent surveyor, to-wit: Belden R. Eaton,
which said survey and map was verified by the affidavit of said
Belden R. Eaton, and, so verified, was presented to the court-

with and as a part of the petition herein; and it further appearing to the court that on or about the 23rd day of August, A. D. 1909, the said petitioners caused an accurate census of the resident population of said territory to be taken, as it was on said 23rd day of August, A. D. 1909, by R. H. Dodge, a resident of said territory, which said census exhibits the name of every head of a family in said territory, and the name of every person a resident in good faith of said territory on said day, and the lot or quarter section of land on which he resides, which said census was verified by the affidavit of R. H. Dodge, the person by whom the same was taken, and, so verified, was presented to the Court with and as a part of the petition herein; that the number of the population in good faith of the said territory, on said 23rd day of August, A. D. 1909, according to said census was two hundred and fifty four; that heretofore, to-wit: on the 24th day of August, A. D. 1909, the said petitioners caused public notice to be given that on the 18th day of October, A. D. 1909, at a special term of the circuit court for Pierce County, Wisconsin, to be held at the court house in the city of Durand, Pepin County Wisconsin, application would be made for an order incorporating the territory hereinafter described as a village by the name of the village of Bay City, which said notice was given by posting in three of the most public places in said territory, and that said notices remained so posted for a period of more than six weeks, from and after the posting thereof; that by the terms of said notice all persons interested were notified and advised that the survey map and census hereinbefore referred to had been left with R. H. Dodge, at his place of business within said territory, and that the same would remain for the examination of all persons interested at all reasonable hours, which said notice, together with proof of posting as aforesaid was, with, and as a part of said petition, duly presented to the court; that the survey, map and

census of said territory hereinafter described, were, on the 24th day of August, A. D. 1909, left at the place of business of R. H. Dodge within said territory, and there remained until the 6th day of October, 1909, a period of more than five weeks, and that during all of said time the same were open to the inspection of all persons interested at all reasonable hours, as fully appears by the affidavit of R. H. Dodge attached to said survey, map and census and presented to the court with and as a part of the petition herein; and it duly appearing to the court that all the requirements of the statutes have been complied with, NOW THEREFORE, on motion of W. C. Owen Esq., attorney for said petitioners,

IT IS ORDERED, That the territory described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at a point on the west line of Lot number four (4), of section number eight (8), in township twenty-four (24) North, of range seventeen (17), west, in Pierce county, Wisconsin, where the same is intersected by the southern boundary line of the right of way of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company, thence proceeding north on the said line to the north west corner of the south east quarter of the south east quarter of section number five, in said township and range; thence east to the north west corner of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of section number four, in said township and range; thence north on the line between the north east quarter of the south west quarter and the north west quarter of the said south west quarter of said section number four, a distance of sixty rods; thence east three and one-third rods; thence in a southeasterly direction a distance of seventy-seven rods, to a point on the north line of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of said section number four fifty rods east from the north west corner of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of said section four; thence east to the north east corner of the

south east quarter of the south west quarter of said section four
thence south on the quarter line of the said section four
to the section line between sections four and nine; thence east
on said section line a distance of four hundred and eighty-seven
feet to the west bank of the Isabelle creek; thence in a south-
easterly direction along the west bank of the Isabelle Creek to
a point where three piling are standing on the bank, which said
piling are twenty-nine and nine-twelfths (29-9/12) feet distant
north west from the north west corner of the iron bridge across
said Isabelle creek in the Maiden Rock and Bay City road; thence
on a direct line to a red oak tree at the intersection of the
west bank of the Isabelle Creek with the southern boundary line
of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Companys right of
way; *in a southeasterly direction*
thence along the west bank of said Isabelle Creek to the
shore of Lake Pepin; thence along the shore of Lake Pepin in a
southwesterly direction to the mouth of Mill Slough; thence in a
northwesterly direction along the east bank of Mill Slough until
it intersects with the southern boundary line of the Chicago,
Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company's right of way; thence in
an easterly direction along the southern boundary line of the
right of way of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company
to the place of beginning, be and the same hereby is incorporated
as a village by the name of BAY CITY, if the electors shall assent
thereto in the manner provided in sections 861, 862, 863, 864,
and 865, of the statutes, and the acts amendatory thereof and
supplementary thereto.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That

R. H. Dodge, W.C.

Jucker and C. A. Hagen

residents of said territory above described, shall perform the
duties of inspectors of the election provided for by the terms of
sections 861, 862, 863, 864, and 865 of the statutes and the acts
amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto.


