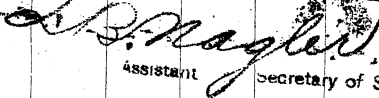

Dagenhart of the town of Blue Mounds in said county of Rome in which said territory above particularly described lies, be and they are hereby named and appointed to perform the duties of inspectors of election as required by the provisions of said Chapter 46 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1898 and the acts amendatory thereto.
