At a regular term of the circuit court in and for Juneau County, State of Wisconsin, begun and held at the Court House in the city of Mauston, in said county, on the 27th day of October, A. D., 1913, and on the 14th day of November, 1913, a day in said term.

IN THE MATTER OF THE INCORPORATION  
OF THE VILLAGE OF HUSTLER.

\*\*\*\*\*

On the application or petition of G. A. Schroeder, William Lahm, T. J. Allen, Ole H. Oleson, W. P. Talg, William Anthony, T. J. Thompson and N. Ahrens for an order that certain territory therein described, and hereinafter described, be incorporated as a village, and said petitioners having appeared by J. T. Dithmar, their attorney, and no one having appeared in opposition, and the court, after hearing the petitioners and witnesses sworn and after having fully considered the allegations, proofs and argument of counsel, and being satisfied,

That the survey, census and map annexed to such petition are correct;

That the said territory contains a village in fact;

That due notice of application for said incorporation was given as required by law, and that all requirements of the statutes with reference to the incorporation of villages have been complied with by said petitioners;

That the lands embraced in said territory ought justly to be included in the proposed village;

That the interests of the inhabitants of said territory will be promoted by such incorporation;

That such territory as ought to be included as aforesaid contained at the time such census was taken, a population in excess of

150 inhabitants as required by Section 854 of the statutes, and the amendments thereto;

That the said territory is not more than one-half square mile in area, to-wit, .47 square miles and is not included in any village and is all lying in the town of Fountain, said county.

Therefore, on motion of J. T. Dithmar, attorney for the petitioners,

IT IS ORDERED, that such territory contained and described as follows, to-wit:

"Commencing at a stake at the section corners common to Sections No. eight (8), nine (9), sixteen (16) and seventeen (17), in Township No. sixteen (16) North, Range two (2) East, in Juneau County, Wisconsin, thence East (var. 4 deg. 10 min. E.) on section line between said Sections nine (9) and sixteen (16), forty-four hundred and eighty-four (4484) feet to a stake; thence North 6 deg. W. (var. 4 deg. 15 min. E.) nineteen hundred and eighty-one (1981) feet to a stake; thence West (var. 4 deg. 10 min. E.) sixty-one hundred and twenty-nine and 5/10 (6129.5) Feet to a stake in the center of the North West quarter (N.W.1/4) of the South East quarter (S.E.1/4) of said Sec. No. eight (8); thence South (var. 4 deg. 17 min. E.) nineteen hundred and fifty (1950) feet to a stake in section line between said Sections No. eight (8) and No. seventeen (17), thence East (var. 4 deg. 10. min.) on the aforesaid section line six hundred and sixty-two and 5/10 feet (662.5) to a stake; thence South [ var. 4 deg. 17 min. E.) six hundred and sixty (660) feet to a stake, thence East (var. 4 deg. 10 Min. E.) thirteen hundred and twenty-five (1325) feet to a stake in the section line between sections No. sixteen (16) and seventeen (17), thence North on the aforesaid section line (var. 4 deg. 17 min.) six hundred and sixty (660) feet to place of beginning" should be incorporated as a village by the name of "The Village of Hustler" if the electors thereof shall assent thereto as provided by law; and it is upon like motion,

FURTHER ORDERED, that Charles Kibner, W. W. Smith  
and Charles Heath, residents of the town of Fountain, in which

said territory lies and is situated, be and are directed to perform the


