Order of Incorporation

State of Wisconsin :

Circuit Court: Ozaukee County.

In the matter of the application of Charles F. Mintzlaff, and others, resident and voters within the limits of the land hereinafter bounded and described for the incorporation of the same, and the inhabitants thereon residing into the Village in said County of Ozaukee, to be called the Village of Grafton.

On reading and filing the verified survey map and census, and notice of said application and proof of the fact that the whole of the same have been left and remained at the store of F.L. Harms, and the rooms occupied at U.S. Post Office within the limits of said proposed Village, from the 14th day of January 1896 to the date hereof. And on proof to the satisfaction of this Court that all the requirements of the Statutes of said State necessary up to the granting of this Order have been complied with by said applicants. That the lands embraced within the limits of such territory ought justly to be included within said proposed Village. That the interests of the inhabitants within said limits will be promoted by such incorporation. That the territory hereinafter described, at the time of such census was taken, and ever and ever since that time contained the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein required, in Section 854 of the Revised Statutes of said State.

On Motion of Eugene S. Turner attorney for said applicants It is by said Court Ordered and this Court does hereby order and declare that the Territory the boundaries of which are hereinafter given and contained within the limits set forth in said application shall be an incorporated Village by the name Village of Grafton.

And it is further by said court ordered and directed hereby; That Charles F. Mintzlaff, Fred L. Harms and Christoph E. Wiepking who reside within the limits of the Town of Grafton within which the Territory of said proposed Village wholly lays are hereby named to perform the duties of Inspectors of Election as required of them by the provisions of Chapter 40 of said

Revised Statutes of Wisconsin and amendments thereto.

The limits, boundaries of said village as hereinbefore designated are as follows to wit: All of Section Number Twenty Four (24) in Township Number Ten (10) North of Range Number Twenty one (21) East. ALL being the Town of Grafton, Ozaukee County in the State of Wisconsin.

Village of Grafton) Number 54,180. Affidavit of Election.

We hereby certify that pursuant to a notice of which the annexed marked H, is a copy, which notice was duly posted up in three places in Section 24 Town 10 North of Range 21 East on the 5th day of March 1896, we the undersigned appointed by order of the Circuit Court for Ozaukee County in the State of Wisconsin as Inspectors of Election did hold an Election at the place in said notice named that we kept the polls of such election open and for the reception of ballots from all qualified voters residing on or within the limits of said Section 24 from 10 o'clock A.M. until 4 o'clock P.M. of the 30 day of March 1896 except one hour from 12 o'clock M to one o'clock P. M. That said voters then and there at said election voted for and against the incorporation of the Village of Grafton. That the whole number of votes cast upon that question at such election were 132.

That of that number 4 had the word no written thereon- and 128 thereof had the word yes written thereon. That we thereby declared said vote to be in favor of such incorporation by 124 majority.

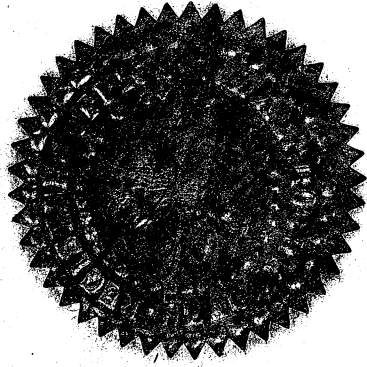

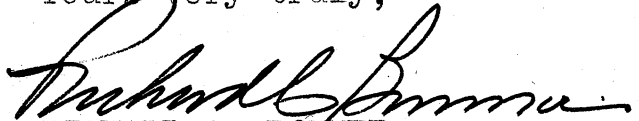
Dear Sir:
