Wm. Caughlin, W. J. Collins and W. H. Kuenzi, being first duly sworn, upon oath depose and say:

That hereto annexed is a certified copy of the ORDER FOR INCORPORATION made by the circuit court of Dodge County, Wisconsin, in the matter of the incorporation of the village of Clyman, in said county, on March 8, 1924, and they are the inspectors of election appointed therein and thereby.

That notice of the meeting of the electors of the territory described in said ORDER FOR INCORPORATION to be held for the purpose of determining whether or not such territory should be an incorporated village was duly given and posted up in seven public places in such territory as required by law.

That such meeting of electors of said territory described in said ORDER FOR INCORPORATION was held pursuant to the aforesaid notice of such meeting at the town hall in the territory in such notice described in the town of Clyman, Dodge County, Wisconsin, on Monday, the 31st day of March, 1924, for the purpose of determining whether or not such territory should be an incorporated village; that at such meeting the polls were opened at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon and were kept open till 5:30 o'clock in the afternoon of that day; that affiants presided at such meeting and acted as inspectors of election, and that affiants designated H. Lekachman and Frank R. Richter as clerks of such meeting, and Albert Metzger and Chas. C. Schmidt as ballot clerks; that hereto annexed, marked Exhibit A, is a duplicate of the official ballot used at such meeting of electors and voted by all persons voting thereat.

That at such meeting the whole number of votes cast was one hundred nine (109), of which one hundred one (101) were cast for incorporation and eight (8) were cast against incorporation; that such meeting of the electors was conducted and the votes were canvassed as required by and according to the statutes of this state regular meetings.

That the election aforesaid resulted in favor of and Filed the incorporation of such village.

In the matter of the incorporation of the village of Clyman. : ORDER FOR INCORPORATION.

On the application by petition of W. J. Collins, Wm. Caughlin, W.H. Kuenzi, H.H. Homberger and Henry J. Stueber for an order that certain territory therein described be incorporated as a village by the name of Clyman, if the electors thereof shall assent thereto as provided by law, the said petitioners having appeared by Lueck, Clark & Lueck, their attorneys, and No

residents or taxpayers of said territory having appeared ~~by~~ ~~any~~ ~~person~~ ~~or~~ ~~firm~~ ~~or~~ ~~corporation~~, against such application, and after hearing the allegations and proofs and considering the same, the court being satisfied, and does so find:

1 - That the survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced within the limits of such village, ^{annexed to such petition,} was made by a practical surveyor as provided by law, and is correct.

2 - That an accurate census of the resident population of such territory was taken as provided by law, ^{and same is annexed to such petition,} and that the same is correct.

3 - That all of the requirements of the statutes of this state have been complied with by such petitioners.

4 - That the lands embraced in said territory ought justly to be included in the proposed village.

5 - That the interests of the inhabitants of such territory will be promoted by such incorporation.

6 - That such territory as ought to be included as aforesaid contained, at the time such census was taken, the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein required in section 61.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:
described

That the following territory shall be an incorporated village by the name of Clyman, if the electors thereof assent thereto as provided by law, such territory being located and situated in the town of Clyman, in the county of Dodge, in the state of Wisconsin, and bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing in the north line of section twenty-eight, township ten north, range fifteen east, 206.7 feet west from the northeast corner of said section; thence west, along said north section line, 964.8 feet to the westerly line of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway right-of-way; thence north $5^{\circ} 58'$ east along

said westerly railway right-of-way line 684 feet; thence west, parallel with the north line of said section twenty-eight, 1151 feet; thence south 680 feet to the north line of said section twenty-eight; thence west on said north line 383 feet to the center point of said section twenty-eight; thence south on the north and south center line of said section 1341 feet to the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of said section twenty-eight; thence east on the south line of said quarter-quarter section 1092 feet to a point 200 feet west of the west line of Main Street of the unincorporated village of Clyman; thence south $6^{\circ} 34'$ west, parallel with said westerly line of said Main Street, 1345 feet, to the east and west center line of said section twenty-eight; thence east, along said center line, 1206.3 feet to a point 451.2 feet west of the east line of said section twenty-eight; thence north $5^{\circ} 58'$ east 2664 feet to the place of beginning; containing 127.97 acres of land.

That Wm. Caughlin and W. J. Collins

and W. H. Kuenzi, residents of such proposed territory in the town of Clyman, in said county of Dodge, be, and hereby are, directed to perform the duties of inspectors of election as provided in sections 61.08 to 61.14, inclusive, of the Wisconsin Statutes, with the powers and duties specified by such sections of the statutes.
