In the Matter of the Application for the Incorporation
of the Village of Stetsonville.

ORDER

The petition and application in the above entitled matter, for incorporation of the Village of Stetsonville, coming on to be heard this 17th day of March, 1949, at a regular term of said Court held at the Courthouse, in the City of Medford, Taylor County, Wisconsin, at the opening of Court on said day, and the Court having heard the matters alleged in said petition, and having considered the same, the Court is satisfied and finds that all the requirements of the Statutes have been complied with, that the requisite number of applicants have signed the petition for the territory that is proposed to be included in said Village of Stetsonville, and that the applicants have caused to be made by a practical surveyor, an accurate survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced in the limits of said Village, showing the courses and distances of the boundaries and the quantity of land contained therein; that such survey and map are verified by the affidavit of said surveyor affixed thereto; that they have caused to be taken an accurate census of the resident population of such territory as it was on the 18th day of January, 1949, and contained a population of three hundred sixteen (316) persons, in which census there was exhibited the name of every head of a family, and the name of every person a resident in good faith of such territory on such day, and the lot or quarter section of land on which he resided, which was verified by the affidavit of the person taking the same, affixed thereto. That such survey, map and census, after completed and verified, as aforesaid, was left at the Office of the Farmers State Bank of Stetsonville, with A. J. Greiner, the Cashier of said

Bank, and was there kept subject to examination at all reasonable hours by every person interested, for a period of five weeks and over, to-wit, from the 18th day of January, 1949, to this date; and that such applicants gave notice that they would apply to the Circuit Court of Taylor County, Wisconsin, in which such territory lies, on the 17th day of March, 1949, for an order incorporating such territory as a village, by the name of "STETSONVILLE", which said notice described the boundaries of such territory by courses and distances, and specified the towns in which it lies, and in which notice it was stated where such survey, map and census had been left and could be examined, as aforesaid; that they caused said notices to be posted in at least three of the most public places of such territory at least three weeks before the time so specified in said notice; that they also caused the said notice to be printed in the Taylor County Star News, a newspaper of general circulation in said territory; that there is now and has been during all said time no newspaper printed within such territory; that the area of said territory is 224.6 acres, and that the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein, complies with the requirements of Section 61.01. The court finds further that there has been filed with the Court no petition protesting against the incorporation of said village.

WHEREUPON, IT IS ORDERED AND DECLARED, that such territory, particularly described as follows:

Beginning 2.25 chains north of the South $1/16$ corner, on the Section Line between Section 13, Township 30, Range 1 East, and Section 18, Township 30, Range 2 East, thence West parallel to the South $1/16$ th line of Section 13, 5.12 chains, to the East side of the Soo Line Railroad right of way, thence southerly along east line of right of way to the $1/16$ line, thence West on $1/16$ line to $1/16$ corner plus 5.00 chains. Thence South 20.00 chains parallel to the East Section Line, thence East on South Section Line 5.00 chains to $1/16$ corner. Thence South on $1/16$ th line 22.60 chains, thence east parallel to the North section line 41.01 chains to the North and South $1/4$ line of Section 19, Thence North on North and South $1/4$ line 19.57 chains.

Thence East parallel to North Section line 1.14 chains. Thence North parallel to the North and South $\frac{1}{4}$ line 3.03 chains. Thence West parallel to the North section line 1.14 chains. Thence North parallel to the West Section Line 20.50 chains to the Northeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 18, thence West on $\frac{1}{16}$ th line to Section line, thence North on Section line to place of beginning, containing 224.6 acres,

shall be an incorporated Village by the name of "STETSONVILLE" if the electors shall ascend thereto, as provided by Chapter 61 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

And, It Is Further Ordered and Directed, that Ray H. Franz, William F. Pueschner and Harold Hauser, three persons of the town or towns in which said territory lies, be, and are hereby named to perform the duties as inspectors of election as provided by Chapter 61 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and particularly Section 61.09 to Section 61.14, inclusive;

STATEMENT OF HOLDING OF
REFERENDUM MEETING

The undersigned, inspectors of election, who presided at the meeting of electors, held in accordance with an order of the Circuit Court for Taylor County, Wisconsin, dated March 17, 1949, in the above entitled matter, do make the following statement in accordance with Section 61.01 (4) of the Wisconsin Statutes for 1947.

The said meeting was held for the purpose of determining whether the electors in the territory described in the above mentioned order desired that said territory be an incorporated Village by the name of Stetsonville. The electors in said territory did, on the 20th day of April, 1949, meet at the Legion Hall in Stetsonville, Taylor County, Wisconsin, in said territory, and at the close of said meeting and in the polling place we publicly canvassed the vote cast and completed the same without adjournment or interruption, and at once publicly announced the result of the election. The following is the result of the canvass:

The whole number of votes cast was 122.

The number cast "For Incorporation" was 121.

The number cast "Against Incorporation" was 1.

The polls were opened at 9:00 A. M. and closed at 8:00 P. M.

That the said election resulted in favor of the incorporation of said Village of Stetsonville, and that the original petition and all accompanying papers, and all such as were added under the direction of the court, the order of the Court for incorporation, and the statement and affidavit of the inspectors, aforesaid, were recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Taylor County, Wisconsin, on April 25, 1949, at 3:00 P. M., in Volume AB of Miscellaneous Records on page 1 to 11 inclusive.
