## ORDER

The petition of Walter Goffin, Paul Edberg, Bernard Belisle, Edward L. Walters, Adam Silack, Ralph Grimh and Chester A. Boncler, in the above entitled matter, having come on to be heard this 2nd day of November, 1953, the same being an adjourned hearing from the 19th day of October, 1953, pursuant to notice duly given by posting, as appears by the affidavit on file herein, and upon reading the same and the census of the resident population of such territory taken within ten weeks of the making of said application and studying the survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced within the limits of such village as prepared by the Sawyer County Surveyor, and the certificates and affidavits attached to said census and survey and map in support thereof; and upon the record and proceedings had herein and after hearing counsel in support of said application and all parties interested in support of and in opposition to said application having been given full opportunity to be heard in open court;

And, it appearing that the survey and map of the territory intended to be embraced within the limits of such village clearly shows the courses and distances of the boundaries and the quantity of land contained therein and that the same is not more than one-half square mile in area, and

It further appearing that the applicants herein caused due notice to be given of the time and place that application will be made to this Court for an order incorporating the territory hereinafter described as a village to be known as the Village of Radisson, by posting a printed notice thereof in three of the most public places in such territory for a period of more than three weeks prior to the time of hearing so specified in said notice, and

It further appearing that all the requirements of the Statutes have been complied with, and that such territory as is proposed to be included contained, at the time such census was taken, the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein required in Section 61.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes,

Now, Therefore, On Motion of Rodney Lee Young, attorney for the applicants,

IT IS ORDERED, that the following territory in the Town of Radisson, Sawyer County, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the corner to Section 14-15-22 & 23, Township 38 North, Range 7 West; thence North on Section line between Section 14 & 15 a distance of Fifteen Hundred Ten (1510) feet; thence at right

angles West a distance of Twenty-three Hundred Twenty-three (2323) feet; thence South parallel to Section line between Sections 14 & 15, 22 & 23, a distance of Fourteen Hundred Forty-eight (1448) feet; thence North  $88^{\circ} 15'$  West along South Boundary of Chicago & Northwest Railroad right-of-way a distance of Three Hundred Fifty-two (352) feet; thence South parallel to East line of Sections 15 & 22 a distance of Seven Hundred Fifty (750) feet, more or less, to the shore of Grimh Lake; thence in a Southeasterly direction along the shore of Grimh Lake to intersection with East & West Quarter line of Section 22; thence East on East & West Quarter line a distance of Two Hundred Ninety and Three-tenths (290.3) feet; thence North parallel with Section line between Sections 22 & 23 a distance of Twenty-six Hundred Sixty (2660) feet to the North line of Section 22; thence East on Section line between Sections 15 & 22 a distance of Four Hundred Twenty-seven and Three-tenths (427.3) feet to place of beginning;

shall be an incorporated village, to be known as Village of Radisson, provided, however, that the electors of the territory above described shall assent thereto, at a meeting to be held within sixty days from this date upon notice duly given, by election by ballot, as provided in Section 61.09 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

It Is Further Ordered, that Adolph Olson, Paul Edberg, and June Walters, of the Town of Radisson, be, and they hereby are, appointed as inspectors of said election and directed to perform the duties of inspectors of election, as provided in Section 61.09 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

STATEMENT OF INSPECTORS OF ELECTION

STATE OF WISCONSIN )  
SAWYER COUNTY ) SS.

We, Adolph Olson, Paul Edberg and June Walters, of the Village of Radisson, Sawyer County, constituting the inspectors of the election duly appointed by the Circuit Court for Sawyer County, in the matter of the incorporation of the Village of Radisson, dated the 2nd day of November, 1953, do hereby certify that due notice of an election to determine whether or not the Village of Radisson should be incorporated was given as provided in Section 61.09 (2) of the Wisconsin Statutes by posting such notice in three of the most public places in such territory at least three weeks previous to such meeting, and that said election was conducted in the Radisson Town Hall on Monday, November 30, 1953. The polls were opened at 2:00 o'clock P. M. and were closed at 4:00 o'clock P. M.

Voting was by printed ballot and the total number of votes cast were sixty-nine; the number cast for incorporation were sixty-five; and the number cast against incorporation were three; and one ballot was voided for having been spoiled.
