The above entitled matter duly coming on for a hearing on the petition of Frederick Rabanstorf, Ole Oleson, Charles T. Casterline, John Roth, Lafayette Johnson, James H. Sargent, Honice Allington, Theodore Hordahl, Hiram F. Sargent, Thomas Potter, Louis I. Roe, George E. Cummins and Harvey E. Lythe, and said petitioners having duly appeared by J.C. Gores and C. B. Culbertson, their attorneys and George B. Parkhill, Esq. appearing for the supervisors of the town of Edson.

And it duly appearing that said petitioner at all times herein mentioned were and still are tax payers and residents of the territory hereinafter described and which is intended to be embraced in a village to be named the village of Stanley, and it further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that on the 11th day of April, 1895, said petitioners caused to be made by a practical surveyor on accurate survey and map of said territory showing the courses and distances of the boundaries and the quantity of land contained therein and that the accuracy of said survey and map was and is, duly verified by the affidavit of said surveyor, Charles A. Alderman, and that said Charles A. Alderman at all times herein mentioned was and is a practical surveyor, residing at the city of Eau Claire, Wisconsin, which said survey and map, together with said affidavit verifying the same is annexed to said petition and

It further duly appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said petitioners have caused to be taken on the eighth day of April, 1895, an accurate census of the resident population of said territory, as it was on said eighth day of April, 1895, exhibiting the name of every head of a family and the name of every person a resident in good faith of such territory on said day, and the lot or quarter section of land on which he resides, which is duly verified by the affidavit of Ole H. Ledum, the person taking the same, and that the resident population contained in said territory according to said census, and in fact, was when said census was taken and now is 1136 in number and that the territory hereinafter described is not included in any village, and contained on said eighth day of April, 1895, a resident population of 1136 persons thereon, and

It further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said accurate survey and map duly completed and verified as aforesaid and said accurate census also duly completed and verified as aforesaid, were left at the store and place of business of said Frederick Rabanstorf, which is within the territory hereinafter described, and that said Frederick Rabanstorf resides in the said territory and has at all times herein mentioned presided therein and that said survey map and census were kept at said place of business of Frederick Rabanstorf aforesaid, subject to examination at all reasonable hours by every person interested, for the period of five consecutive weeks and more, from the time of posting and of the first publication of said notice, namely; constantly and continuously from and including the said 12th day of April 1895, to and including the 24th day of May 1895, and

It further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said petitioners have given due notice of the application for the incorporation of said village in all respects pursuant to law by causing said notice to be printed, and published in a newspaper printed and published within the said territory of the proposed village, to-wit: "The Stanley Journal", a weekly newspaper, once each week for six consecutive weeks previous to the times specified for making said application and that "The Stanley Journal" in the only newspaper printed or published in the territory herein after described, and

It further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said petitioners have caused to be posted four of said printed notices in four of the most public places in the territory hereinafter described, and that said four notices so posted as aforesaid, have constantly and continuously remained so posted ever since the time of said posting up to and including the 24th day of May, 1895, and

The Court After said hearing being satisfied of the correctness of said survey and census, and that all the requirements of the statutes have been complied with, that all the lands embraced in the territory hereinafter described ought justly to be indeeded in the proposed village, and that the interest of the inhabitants will be promoted by the incorporation thereof, and that said territory at the time said census was taken contained the population in number and in proportion to the quantity of land therein required by law, now therefor on all the papers in the above entitled matter now on file and on all the proceeds had herein, after hearing J.C.Gores, Esq. one of the attorneys for said petitioners in favor of said motion and George B. Parkhill in opposition thereto, on motion of J.C.Gores

It is Ordered that the territory named in the petition and hereinafter described be, and hereby is, incorporated and the same shall be an incorporated village by the name of the Village of Stanley.

The following is a description of the boundaries of said village, by courses and distances, namely:

Beginning at the North-east corner of the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section number twenty-five (25), in Township number twenty-nine (29), North, of Range Number five (5) West, and running thence West on the North line of said Section and on the North line of Section twenty-six (26) in said Town and Range, one and one-half (1 and  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) miles to the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section number twenty-six (26), in Township twenty-nine (29) North, of Range five (5) West, thence South on the North and South quarter line of said Section twenty-six (26), and on the North and South quarter line of Section thirty-five (35), in said Town and Range, one and one-half (1 and  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) miles to the Southwest corner of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section number thirty-five (35), in Township twenty-nine (29), North, of Range five (5), West, thence East on the East and West quarter line of Section number thirty-five (35), in said Town and Range and on the East and West quarter line of Section number thirty-six (36), in said

Town and Range, one and one-half (1 and  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) miles to the Southeast corner of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section number thirty-six (36), Township twenty-nine (29), north, of Range five (5), West; thence North on the East line of Section number thirty-six (36), in Township twenty-nine (29), North, of Range five (5), West, and on the East line of Section twenty-five (25), in said Town and Range, one and one-half (1 and  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) miles, to the Northeast corner of the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section number twenty-five (25), in Township number twenty-nine (29), North, of Range five (5), West, which point is the point of beginning, including and containing all of Section number twenty-five (25) the East one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ), of Section number twenty-six (26), the North one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ), of Section number thirty-six (36) and the Northeast quarter of Section number thirty-five (35), all in Township, twenty-nine (29), North of Range five (5), West, and containing fourteen hundred and forty acres, or two and one-fourth square miles of land.

and it is further ordered that Frederick Rabanstorff, James H. Sargent and Louis I. Roe of the said Village of Stanley be, and they are hereby appointed and directed to perform the duties of inspectors of election as required by chapter forty of the revised statutes of Wisconsin and acts amendatory thereof, said Frederick Rabanstorff, James H. Sargent and Louis I. Roe, having stated in open court that they are willing to serve as such inspectors and no one having apposed their appointment.

## STATEMENT OF ELECTION

The following is a true and correct statement of the holding of the meeting of electors of the territory hereafter described and the result of said election.

A meeting of the electors of the territory consisting of all of section number twenty-five (25), the east one-half of section number twenty-six (26), the north one-half of section number thirty-six (36), and the northeast quarter of section number thirty-five (35), all in township number twenty-nine (29) north, of range number five (5), West, in the county of Chippewa State of Wisconsin, was held at a certain hall, generally known as and commonly called "Union Hall", being the upstairs part of a certain building, the lower part of which is occupied by John Chalkley as and for his dwelling place on Stanley Street, and which said building is situate on lot number eleven (11), in block number one (1), in the Original plat of Stanley, as platted and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of the said County of Chippewa, State of Wisconsin; on the twenty-second day of June, 1895, for the purpose of determining whether or not, the territory mentioned and described in the notice of said meeting of electors, and consisting of all of section number Twenty-five (25) the east one-half of section number Twenty-six (26), the North one-half of Section number thirty-six (36), and the Northeast quarter of section number thirty-five (35), all in Township number twenty-nine (29) North, of Range number Five (5), west, with said county of Chippewa, should be an incorporated Village. That said hall was a convenient place for said meeting.

That said meeting of the electors of the territory was held in pursuance of and in accordance with a notice of a meeting of the said electors of said territory given by the undersigned inspectors, who were duly appointed as such by an order of the Circuit Court of the County of Chippewa, State of Wisconsin, made and entered on the 25th day of May, 1895, that a copy of said notice is hereto attached marked "Exhibit A" and is hereby made a part of this statement.

That there is a newspaper published and printed in the territory hereinbefore mentioned and described, that the name of said newspaper is "The Stanley Journal", that said notice was duly published therein once in each week for four successive weeks previous to such meeting; that hereto annexed and made a part hereof is the affidavit of Clarence B. Culbertson, who is one of the trustees of said Stanley Journal of the due publication of said notice that said affidavit of publication is hereto annexed and Marked "Exhibit B", that copies of said notice were also duly posted in at least five of the most public places in said territory at least three weeks previous to said meeting, in addition to the publication thereof in said Stanley Journal; that hereto annexed and made a part hereof is the affidavit of Clarence B. Culbertson, the person who posted said copies of said notices as aforesaid; that said affidavit of the posting of the said copies of said notice is hereto annexed and marked "Exhibit C".

That at said meeting on the said twenty second day of June 1895, the polls were duly opened at ten o'clock in the forenoon and were kept open until four o'clock in the afternoon when they were duly closed.

That the undersigned inspectors duly presided and acted as inspectors of election at said meeting and duly designated D.F. Donahue as Clerk thereof; that the qualified
