





# AN ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Wausau do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Territory Annexed. In accordance with Chapter 66, Wisconsin Statutes, and the petition for direct annexation signed by Andrea N. Johnson, Rob Gascoigne, Marsha Hickman, Deborah A. Turk, John W. Weix, and Rodney T. Gorski, constituting 100 percent of the electors within and 100 percent of the owners of the land now located in the Town of Wausau, Marathon County, Wisconsin, residing therein, the following described land is hereby annexed to the City of Wausau:

#### SEE ATTACHED LEGAL DESCRIPTION

Section 2. Effect of Annexation. From and after the date of publication of this ordinance, the territory described in Section 1 shall be a part of the City of Wausau and of the D.C. Everest Area School District for any and all purposes provided by law, and all persons coming or residing within such territory shall be subject to all ordinances, rules and regulations governing the City of Wausau, and governing the School District.

<u>Section 3. Zoning Classifications.</u> Zoning of the within real estate shall be pursuant to Section 23.04.020, <u>Zoning of Annexed Lands</u>, of the Wausau Municipal Code.

Section 4. Aldermanic District. The territory described in Section 1 of this ordinance is hereby made a part of the 2nd Aldermanic District and the 45th Ward of the City of Wausau, subject to the ordinances, rules and regulations of the city, county, and state, governing districts.

<u>Section 5.</u> The State of Wisconsin, Department of Commerce, has favorably reviewed the annexation and found it not to be against the public interest.

Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, or if the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this

ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication

as provided by law.
