## CHARTER ORDINANCE.

To amend section 66.06 of the statutes insofar as it applies to the City of Stoughton, Wisconsin by adding a new subsection (16) relating to ornamental street lighting.

By authority of Section 3 of Article XI of the Wisconsin Constitution and pursuant to the provisions of section 66.001 of the statutes.

The Mayor and Council of the City of Stoughton do ordain as follows: Section I. Section 66.06 of the statutes is hereby amended insofar as it applies to the City of Stoughton by the addition of a new subsection to read: Section 66.06(16). The common council is empowered to provide for the construction, maintenance and operation of an ornamental street lighting system on any street or public ground within the city, and to provide for defraying the cost of the same. Such cost may be paid in whole or in part from the general fund of the city or from special assessments levied on the property benefited in such proportion and according to such method as the council shall determinë.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect sixty days after passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of subsection (5) of Section 66.001 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
