A CHARTER ORDINANCE

A Charter Ordinance Amending Subsection (9)(c) of Section 62.13 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1931, relating to the Police and Fire Departments, insofar as the same pertains to the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin.

By authority of Section 3 of Article XL of the Wisconsin Constitution and pursuant to the provisions of Section 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

1. Subsection (9)(c) of Section 62.13 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1931 is hereby amended insofar as the same pertains to the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, by adding to paragraph 3 thereof the following:

"It is provided, however, that the pension of any member who shall retire during the year 1933, shall be based upon the salary which said member received during the year 1932."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect sixty days after its passage and publication, provided, however, that if within such sixty days a petition signed by a number of electors of the city equal to not less than seven per cent of the votes cast therein for governor at the last general election shall be filed in the office of the city clerk, demanding that this ordinance be submitted to a vote of the electors, then and in such case this ordinance shall not be in effect until the same has been submitted to a referendum and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

I, Alfred W. Bareis, do hereby certify that I am the duly elected, qualified and acting city clerk for the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin.

That the annexed ordinance is a true and correct copy of a charter ordinance duly passed and adopted by the Common Council of the City of Madison.

That at a regular meeting of the Common Council held on the 10th day of February, 1933, said charter ordinance was introduced before the Common Council by Alderman Mills, and was at such time duly read the first and second times and thereupon duly referred to the Ordinance Committee; that on the 9th day of March, 1933, the said Ordinance Committee considered said ordinance, by a majority vote of said committee the same was recommended to the Common Council for adoption; that said ordinance committee on the 10th day of March, 1933, duly returned said ordinance to the Common Council and the same was then and thereupon read a third time and upon a call of the ayes and noes the same was duly adopted, the following aldermen present having voted in the affirmative: Alderman Alford, Armbricht, Conlin, Deadman, Grady, Kraege, Kruger, Lindauer, Lunder, Mills, Parr, Reis, Rupp, Schmiege, Schneider, Schultz, and Wolf, and Gallagher.

and the following in the negative: None.

That on the 16th day of March, 1933, the said ordinance was duly published in two daily newspapers in the City of Madison, to-wit: The Wisconsin State Journal and the Capital Times; that sixty days have elapsed since said publication, such sixty days having expired on the 15th day of May, 1933.

I further certify that said ordinance was duly adopted by more than a two thirds vote of the members elect of the Common Council of the City of Madison and that during the sixty days hereinbefore mentioned no petition for referendum was filed in the office of the clerk of the said city.

I further certify that said ordinance was initiated by the Common Council and not by the electors of said city.

I further certify that as the city clerk I keep a permanent record book for the purpose of recording all charter ordinances and that I have duly recorded in such book kept for that purpose the charter ordinance, copy of which is hereto annexed, together with a statement therein of the manner of its adoption.

I further certify that on the 16th day of May, 1933, I caused to be duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State for Wisconsin, a true and correct copy of said ordinance as provided by law.
