A CHARTER ORDINANCE

THEODORE DAMMANN

A Charter Ordinance Amending Section 67.05, Subsection (7), Paragraphs (b) and (c) of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1933 relating to Referendums for Issuance of Bonds insofar as the same applies to the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin.

By authority of Section (3) of Article XI of the Wisconsin Constitution, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

1. Section 67.05, Subsection (7), Paragraphs (b) and (c) of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1933 is hereby amended insofar as the same pertains to the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin to read as follows:

"(b) An initial resolution adopted by the common council of any city for an issue of bonds in excess of fifty thousand dollars for any one issue for purposes specifically enumerated in subsection (5) need not shall be submitted to the electors as provided in subsection (5). An initial resolution adopted by the common council for an issue of bonds of fifty thousand dollars or less for any one issue for purposes specifically enumerated in subsection (5) need not be submitted to the electors as provided in said subsection (5), unless within thirty days after the recording thereof there shall be filed in the office of the city clerk a petition requesting such submission, signed by electors numbering at least ten percent of the votes cast for governor in the city at the last general election. If such petition be filed, proceedings shall be had as provided by subsection (5). But any such resolution may, in the discretion of the city council, by separate recorded resolution, be submitted to popular vote without waiting for the filing of said petition.

"(c) An initial resolution adopted by the common council of a city for an issue of bonds for paying the city's portion of the cost of abolishing grade crossings, shall ~~not~~ be submitted to popular vote."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect sixty days after its passage and publication, provided, however, that if within such

sixty days a petition signed by a number of electors of the city equal to not less than seven per cent of the votes cast therein for Governor at the last General Election shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk demanding that this ordinance be submitted to a vote of the electors, then and in such case this ordinance shall not be in effect until the same shall have been submitted to a referendum and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

and the following in the negative; None

Absent: Alderman Lawrence.

That on the 13th day of July, 1935, the said ordinance was duly published in two daily newspapers in the City of Madison, to-wit: The Wisconsin State Journal and the Capital Times, that sixty days have elapsed since said publication, such sixty days having expired on the 11th day of September, 1935.


I further certify that said ordinance was duly adopted by more than a two thirds vote of the members elect of the Common Council of the City of Madison and that during the sixty days hereinbefore mentioned no petition for referendum was filed in the office of the clerk of the said city.

I further certify that said ordinance was initiated by the Common Council and not by the electors of said city.

I further certify that as the city clerk I keep a permanent record book for the purpose of recording all charter ordinances and that I have duly recorded in such book kept for that purpose the charter ordinance, copy of which is hereto annexed, together with a statement therein of the manner of its adoption.

I further certify that on the 18th day of September, 1935, I caused to be duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State for Wisconsin, a true and correct copy of said ordinance as provided by law.
