A CHARTER ORDINANCE

By Alderman Kraege

A charter Ordinance to Amend Section 27.08(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes relating to Public Parks.

Pursuant to authority granted by Section 3 of Article XI of the Constitution, and Section 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes,

The Mayor and the Common of the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

1. Subsection (2) of Section 27.08 of the Wisconsin Statutes, so far as it pertains to the City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(2) Appointments, Terms. Said board shall consist of seven members, two aldermen and five citizen members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Common Council. The aldermen members shall be appointed in April for the term of one year beginning on the first day of May. The full term of each citizen member shall be the five years beginning on the first day of January next following his appointment and until his successor is appointed and qualified. But when the board is first constituted the respective appointments shall be for terms ending one or more years after the first day of January next succeeding the appointments, but so distributed that not more than one term in addition to that of the aldermen members will end in any one year. In the month of November or the month of December next preceding the ending of any citizen member's term, the mayor shall appoint his successor for a full term and submit the appointment to the Common Council for confirmation."

2. This ordinance shall be in effect sixty days after its passage and publication, provided, however, that if within such sixty days a petition signed by a number of electors of the city equal to not less than seven per cent of the votes cast therein for governor at the last general election shall be filed in the office of the city clerk demanding that this ordinance be submitted to a vote of the electors, then and in such case this ordinance shall not be in effect until the same has been submitted to a referendum and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

Absent: Alderman Winckler.


That on the 2nd day of March, 1936, the said ordinance was duly published in two daily newspapers in the City of Madison, to-wit: The Wisconsin State Journal and the Capital Times, that sixty days have elapsed since said publication, such sixty days having expired on the 1st day of May, 1936.

I further certify that said ordinance was duly adopted by more than a two thirds vote of the members elect of the Common Council of the City of Madison and that during the sixty days hereinbefore mentioned no petition for referendum was filed in the office of the clerk of the said city.

I further certify that said ordinance was initiated by the Common Council and not by the electors of said city.

I further certify that as the city clerk I keep a permanent record book for the purpose of recording all charter ordinances and that I have duly recorded in such book kept for that purpose the charter ordinance, copy of which is hereto annexed, together with a statement therein of the manner of its adoption.

I further certify that on the 4th day of May, 1936, I caused to be duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State for Wisconsin, a true and correct copy of said ordinance as provided by law.
