Incorporation of the Village of Hamilton.

At a general term of said court, begun and held at the Court House in the village of Hurley, in the town of Vaughn in said county, on the 8th day of HJanuary, A. D. 1917.

present and presiding, Hon. G. N. Risjord, Circuit Judge, this 8th day of January, 1917.

The application and petition of Frank B. Goodman, Hugo F. Ringo, Daniel E. Sullivan, Joseph B. Meade, John M. Price and Donald E. McDonell for an order to incorporate the territory therein described as a village coming on to be heard this day, Wm. F. Shea, Esq. appearing as attorney for said petitioners,

Upon reading and filing said petition and after hearing the evidence adduced upon said hearing, and having fully considered the same and the arguments of counsel, the court finds:

That the survey, map and census annexed to said petition are correct; that the territory therein and hereinafter described contained at the time such census was taken a population of 1489 persons, and that the area of said territory is 1052.2 acres; that due notice of the application for said incorporation was given as required by law, and that all the requirements of the statute with reference to the incorporation of villages have been complied with, said petitioners; now upon motion of said Wm. F. Shea, attorney for said petitioners,-

IT IS ORDERED, that the territory described in said map, survey and petition, and hereinafter described, shall be incorporated as a village by the name of "Hamilton", if the electors thereof shall assent thereto in the manner prescribed

by law. Said territory is situated in the town of Montreal, in said county of Iron, state of Wisconsin, and comprises the SW $\frac{1}{4}$, and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, of Section 27, the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 28, the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 33, and the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34, all in township 46 north, range 2 east, and is bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the boundary line between sections 32 and 33 in township 46 north, range 2 east, and the east and west quarter-line of said section 33, and running thence north 89 degrees, 3 minutes and 30 seconds east, 2893.09 feet on said quarter-line to the center of said section 33; thence north 89 degrees, 3 minutes and 30 seconds east, 2812.65 feet on said quarter-line to the quarter-corner on the east line of said section 33; thence north 24 minutes and 30 seconds west, 1325.97 feet on the easterly boundary of said section 33 to the northeast corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section; thence north 88 degrees, 17 minutes and 30 seconds east, 2571.81 feet to the southeast corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34 in said township and range; thence South 89 degrees, 19 minutes and 30 seconds east, 13335.26 feet to the southeast corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 34; thence north 2 degrees, 44 minutes and 30 seconds east, 1500.34 feet on the eastern boundary of said last described part to the northeast corner thereof; thence north 5 degrees, 53 minutes and 30 seconds east, 2737.19 feet to the northeast corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 27, in the township and range aforesaid; thence south 89 degrees and 12 minutes west, 1326.59 feet on the east and west quarter-line of said section 27 to the center of said section; thence south 89 degrees and 12 minutes west, 2969.51 feet on said quarter-line to the quarter-post between said section 27 and section 28 in the township and range aforesaid; thence south 85 degrees, 56 minutes and 30 seconds west, 2406.73 feet on the east and west quarter-line of said section 28 to the center of said section; thence south 85 degrees 56 minutes and 30 seconds west, 2958.95 feet along said

quarter-line to the quarter-corner between said section 28 and section 29 in the township and range aforesaid; thence south 1 degree, 43 minutes west, 2621.15 feet on the west boundary of said section 28 to the common section-corner of said sections 28, 29, 32 and 33 in said township and range; and thence south 5 degrees and 3 minutes west 2552.80 feet on the west boundary of said section 33 to the place of beginning.

Upon like motion, it is further ORDERED:

That Oliver M. Schaus, J. Peter Diericks and L. P. Ulven, residents of said town of Montreal and of the territory hereinbefore described, be and they hereby are appointed and directed to perform the duties of inspectors of the election to be held for the purpose of determining whether or not such territory shall be an incorporated village, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided.

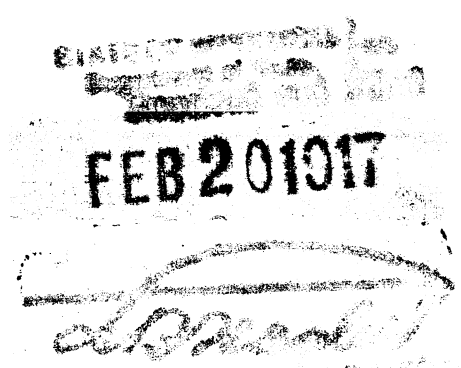
We, the undersigned inspectors of election, hereby certify:

That on the 9th day of February, 1917, a meeting or election was held at the "New Shop Building" of the Montreal Mining Company at the Montreal Mine in the territory hereinafter described, for the purpose of determining whether or not such territory should be incorporated as a village. Said territory is in the town of Montreal, Iron County, Wisconsin, and is particularly described as follows, to-wit: The SW $\frac{1}{4}$, and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, of section 27, the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of section 28, the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of section 33, and the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$, of section 34, all in township 46 north, range 2 east, the area of which is 1052.2 acres.

And we further certify that the whole number of ballots given at such meeting or election was forty-five (45) of which forty (40) had thereon the word "yes" and five (5) had thereon the word "no".
