

Incorporation of the Village of Galesville

In Circuit Court Trempealeau County, In matter of the Application for the Incorporation of the Village of Galesville

Upon Examination of Petition survey map census, notices and affidavits et c. hereto annexed

It is therefore Ordered that the following described Territory situated in the County of Trempealeau and State of Wisconsin, to wit: Commencing at a point (32 rods) Thirty two rods, East of the North west Corner of the South East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the South west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) in Section Twenty Eight (28) in Township Nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West. Thence South on a line Two (2) rods East of Thompsons & Walker's and Arnolds Addition to the Village of Galesville, and on the East line of the Galesville Cemetery to the South East corner of said Cemetery, thence West on the South line thereof to the West side of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North west quarter of Section Thirty-three (33) in Township Nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West, thence South to the South line of the North west quarter of said Section Thirty-three (33), thence West on the quarter line to a point Twenty six (26) rods West of the South East corner of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-one (31) same Town and Range, thence North Eighty (80) rods or to the South line of the North East quarter of the North East quarter of said Section Thirty-one (31), thence East Twenty six (26) rods to the East Section line of said Section Thirty-one (31), thence North to the North East corner of said Section Thirty-one (31), thence East one hundred Sixty (160) rods to the South East corner of the South west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-nine (29) Township Nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West. Thence North Eighty (80) rods, thence East on the one eight ($\frac{1}{8}$) to the place of beginning shall be an incorporated Village by the name of Galesville.

And it is further Ordered that the following named persons viz: Isaack Clark, Geo. H. Smith and Moses King be and as hereby appointed as inspectors of Election as required by

VILLAGE OF GALESVILLE --- INCORPORATION

ORDER OF COURT

In Circuit Court, Trempealeau County.

At a general term of the Circuit Court in and for the County of Trempealeau, and the State of Wisconsin, began and held at the Court House in the village of Whitehall in said County on the thirteenth day of June 1887.

Present, Hon. A. W. Newman, Judge.

In the matter of Incorporation)

Application having been made to this Court by petition of more than five tax-payers and residents of the territory hereinafter described, and it appearing that accurate map and survey of such territory was duly made by a practical surveyor and verified by him; that an accurate census of the resident population of such territory was duly taken on a day not more than ten weeks prior to said application, which said census exhibited the head of every family, and the name of every person a resident in good faith of such territory on such day and the lot or quarter section of land on which he resided, which said census was duly verified by the person taking the same; that said survey map and census was left at the place of business within such territory, of George W. Gale who resided in such territory and there kept subject to examination at all reasonable hours by all persons interested for a period of five weeks from the publication of the notice of such application hereinafter stated; that the applicants have given due notice of the time that application would be made for an order incorporating such territory as a village by a name therein specified, said notice describing the boundaries of such territory by courses and distances and specifying the town or towns in which it lies, and stating where said survey map and census would be left to be examined as aforesaid, and such notice having been printed and published once in each week for six consecutive weeks previous to the time specified for making said application, in a weekly newspaper published in such territory, as appears by the affidavit of the publisher of said newspaper with said notice attached, and said application having therein set forth the boundaries of such territory, with the courses and distances, the quantity of land therein embraced according to such survey, and the resident population therein contained, according to such census; such survey, map, and census and the affidavit verifying the same, and an affidavit that they were left and kept subject to examination as provided by section 856 of chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Wisconsin, also a copy of the notice of the application aforesaid with an affidavit thereto affixed of the publication of the same being annexed to said petition, and the same having been presented at the time specified in the notice for presenting the same and the matter having been by an order of this Court referred to the Hon Hugh Cameron to investigate and report as to the advisability of such incorporation and the said Hugh Cameron having failed to act in the premises and said order being and is hereby booked and the matter coming on to be heard at this present term and the Court having heard all the parties interested for or against such application who appeared therein and being satisfied of the correctness of said survey and census; that all the requirements of the Statute have been complied with; that the lands embraced in such territory ought justly to be included in the proposed village; that the interest of the inhabitants will be promoted by such incorporation; and that such territory contained at the time such census was taken, the population in number and proportion to the quantity of land therein required by Statute, it is therefore:

ORDERED :

That the following described territory situated in the County of Trempealeau and the State of Wisconsin, towit:

Commencing at a point 32 rods east of the N. W. corner of the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section twenty eight (28) township nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West; thence south on a line two (2) rods east of Thompson, Arnold and Walker's addition to the Village of Galesville and on the East line of the Galesville Cemetery to the South east corner of said Cemetery; thence west on the south line thereof to the west side of the North East quarter of the North West quarter of section thirty three (33) township Nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West; thence South to the South line of the North West quarter of said section thirty three (33); thence west on the quarter line to a point twenty six (26) rods west of the South East corner of the North East quarter of section thirty one (31) same township and range; thence North Eighty rods (80), or to the South line of the North East quarter of the North East quarter of said section thirty one (31); thence East twenty six (26) rods to the East section line of said section thirty one (31); thence North to the North East corner of said section thirty one (31); thence East one hundred and sixty rods to the South East corner of the South West quarter of section twenty nine (29) township nineteen (19) North of Range Eight (8) West; thence North eighty (80) rods; thence East on the eighth line to the place of beginning, shall be an incorporated Village by the name of GALESVILLE.

And it is further ordered that the following named persons viz: Isaac Clark, George H. Smith and Moses King be and hereby are appointed as Inspectors of Election as required by chapter forty (40) of the Revised Statutes of Wisconsin, said persons being residents of the town of Gale in which such territory is located.

CERTIFICATE OF DETERMINATION

We the undersigned inspectors of an election held at the Town Hall of the Town of Gale, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin on the First day of August 1887, pursuant to the notice hereunto annexed for the purpose of determining as to whether the territory described in said notice shall be incorporated as a Village or not, declare that said election was duly held pursuant to said notice and that the following is a true and correct statement of the result of said election, viz:

The whole number of votes cast at said election was One Hundred Twelve (112); The number of ballots cast at said election having thereon the word "Yes" was Eighty (80); The number of ballots cast at said election having thereon the word "No" was Thirty Two (32).

We therefore certify that the electors of said territory have decided by said vote to incorporate said territory as an incorporated Village.
