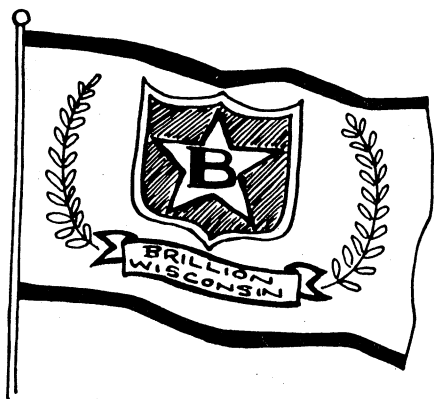

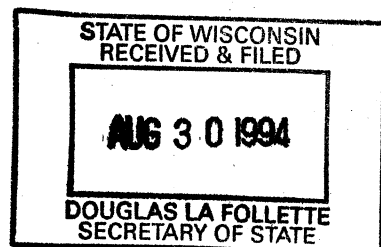

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING PROPERTY OF
ART AND MARY ZINKEL TO THE CITY OF BRILLION
FROM THE TOWN OF BRILLION, CALUMET COUNTY, WISCONSIN

The Common Council of the City of Brillion do ordain as follows:

SECTION I: That as requested in the petition by Art and Mary Zinkel the following property is hereby directly annexed from the Town of Brillion, Calumet County, Wisconsin to the City of Brillion, pursuant to Sec. 66.021(12), Wisconsin Statutes, with all owners to said parcel and electors in said territory being unanimously in favor of such annexation, which property is more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the East 1/4 corner of Section 35; Thence North 89° 44'30" West 312.57 feet along the North line of the Southeast 1/4 Section 35; Thence South 03° 44'13" East 348.56 feet; Thence South 26° 05'27" East 116.89 feet; Thence South 62° 02'51" East 281.07 feet to the East line of the Southeast 1/4 Section 35; Thence North 19° 41'46" East 319.53 feet; Thence North 03° 23'14" West 236.36 feet; Thence North 84° 15'49" West 103.67 feet to the West line Southwest 1/4 Section 36; Thence North 00° 58'37" West 32.20 feet along said line to the Point of Beginning.

And the East half of the Southeast 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 35 in Township 20 North, Range 20 East, less and excepting Certified Survey Maps #485, #721 & #722.

All in the Town of Brillion, Calumet County, Wisconsin and containing 21.92 acres more or less.

SECTION II: That such annexed territory shall become part of the Second Ward of the City of Brillion and shall be zoned "A" Agriculture.

SECTION III: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.




