At a regular term of the Circuit Court for Marathon County begun and held at the court house in the City of Wausau on the 8th. day of February, 1904, and on the 14th. day of May, 1904, during said term

Present Honorable W. C. Silverthorn, Judge Presiding.

A petition having been duly made and filed and presented to the court for the incorporation of the Village of Schofield, signed and sworn to by G. K. Schroeder, August Zank, F. W. Wendorf, F. B. Fullmer, Louis Jones and the Brooks & Ross Lumber Company, and the court having been satisfied and having found that the allegations of said petitioners are true; that the survey annexed is true and correct; that the census annexed is true and correct; and that all the requirements of the statute have been complied with; that the proper notice of such application has been given; that said survey, map and census have been left for inspection the requisite time and as required by law; that such territory proposed to be included contained at the time of such census and does now contain the requisite population for a village and the quantity of land proposed to be incorporated is proper to be incorporated into a village.

Now, therefore, on petition of Kreutzer, Bird & Rosenberry, attorneys for petitioners

IT IS ORDERED That the East half of section twelve (12) and the East half of section thirteen (13), township twenty-eight (28) north, of range seven (7) east, and the West half of section seven (7), the South half of the southeast quarter of section seven (7), the North half of the Northeast quarter and the Northwest fractional quarter of section eighteen (18), township twenty-

eight (28) north, of range eight (8) east, Marathon County, Wisconsin, be and the same hereby is an incorporated village by the name of the VILLAGE OF SCHOFIELD, if the electors of said territory shall assent thereto by vote at the election to be hereinafter provided for.

The boundaries of such village by courses and distances are as follows, to-wit:-

Commencing at the section corner common to sections 13, 18, 19 and 24 on the range line between ranges 7 and 8, thence running north on the range line 39.92 chains to the quarter section corner between sections 13 and 18 Mag Var $4^{\circ}30'$ east, thence running east on the quarter section line in section 18 to the quarter section corner in the center of Section 18, 24.15 chains Mag Var 5° east, thence north on the quarter section line 20.12 chains to the one-eighth section corner Mag Var $3^{\circ}10'$ east, thence east on the $1/8$ section line 39.25 chains to the $1/8$ section corner on the section line between sections 17 and 18 Mag Var $4^{\circ}15'$ east, thence north on the section line 20.02 to the section corner common to sections 7, 8, 17 and 18 Mag Var 4° east, thence north on the section line between sections 7 and 8 20.00 chains to the $1/8$ section corner Mag Var 5° east, thence running west on the $1/8$ section line in section 7, 39-88 chains to the $1/8$ section corner on the $\frac{1}{4}$ section line Mag Var 6° east, thence north on the $\frac{1}{4}$ section line 59.935 chains to the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner between sections 6 and 7 Mag Var 5° east, thence west on the section line 24-53 chains to the section corner on the range line common to sections 1, 6, 7 and 12 Mag Var 4° east. Thence west on the section line between sections 1 and 12 39.61 chains to the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner between sections 1 & 12 Mag Var $4^{\circ} 12'$ east, thence south on the $\frac{1}{4}$ section line in section 12, 79.62 chains to the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner between sections 12 and 13 Mag Var $6^{\circ} 24'$ east, thence south on the $\frac{1}{4}$ section line in sections 13, 79.80 chains to the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner between sections 13 and 24 Mag Var 4° east, thence east on the section line between sections 13 and 24, 40.86 chains to the section corner on the range line common to sections 13, 18, 19 and 24, the place of beginning. Enclosed within the above described line there are 1095.69 acres.

It is further ordered that August Zank Sr. F. B. Felmer and Joe Delesle

three reputable citizens and residents of said territory be and they are hereby named as inspectors of election for the purpose of determining whether or not such territory shall be an incorporated village. Said inspectors, shall, within sixty days from this date, hold an election within the above described territory at which all qualified electors resident in such territory may vote by ballott whether or not such territory shall be incorporated. They shall give the notice required by law for such election and after canvassing such votes, shall report the result thereof to this court. In case a majority of the ballots cast shall be infavor of such incorporation, then this order shall remain a valid order of incorporation and such territory be an incorporated village by the name of the VILLAGE OF ~~WINDY~~ ^{Schofield} from and after this date, ^{this order is recorded} In case a majority of such ballots shall be against such incorporation, then this entire proceedings shall be void.
