**A CHARTER ORDINANCE 84-4
TO PROVIDE FOR ELECTION AT LARGE OF THE
ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CORNELL,
CHIPPEWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN**

The common Council of the City of Cornell, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 1.03(2) of the Municipal Code of the City of Cornell, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

(2). ELECTION; TERM.

(a). **Mayor.** The Mayor shall be elected at the regular City election in even-numbered years of a term of 2 years commencing on the 3rd Tuesday of April in the year of his election.

(b). **Aldermen.** Eight aldermen shall be elected from the City at large. The first election to elect aldermen shall be held at the regular spring election in April, 1985. Of the aldermen elected at such election, the four receiving the most votes shall be elected for a two year term, and the four receiving the second highest number of votes shall be elected for a one year term, and thereafter at each alternate annual election for a term of two years.

(c). **Municipal Judge.** A Municipal Judge shall be elected at the regular City election in odd-numbered years for a term of 2 years commencing on May 1, in the year of his election.

(d). **Other Elective Officers.** The City Clerk-Treasurer shall be elected at the regular City election in even-numbered years for terms of 2 years commencing May 1 in the year of his or her election.

SECTION 2: Election is hereby made that any provisions of Section 62.09 of the Wisconsin Statutes are inapplicable to the City of Cornell, to the extent that this charter ordinance is in any way inconsistent therewith.

SECTION 3: This is a charter ordinance and shall take effect sixty (60) days after its passage and publication, however, if during said sixty day period, a petition is filed in accordance with Section 66.01(5) of the Wisconsin Statutes, demanding that such ordinance be submitted to a vote of the electors, it shall not take effect until it shall have been submitted to a vote of the electors, and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

(2). ELECTION; TERM.

Mayor Ploof called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. at the Council Chambers. Aldermen present: Ellis, Koskey, Krank, Tonnancour, Gavitt, Hurlburt, Gingras 8:15-9:15, Clerk-Treasurer DeJongh. Absent: Spletter. Guests present: Joe Reali, Mark Robarge, Tom McChesney, Jack McChesney.

Motion by Ellis, seconded by Tonnancour to accept minutes of May 17 and special meeting of May 31. Carried 6 ayes, 2 absent.

Joe Reali inquired about the ordinances governing mobile home trailers in the City. He would like to relocate a new trailer home on the same property, but not necessarily in the the same place as the other trailer presently on the property. Referred to Clerk-Treasurer DeJongh to examine ordinance and report back to Council at the next meeting.

Koskey was approached by a citizen, inquiring about putting a mobile home in an agricultural zoned area, since there was already one on Johnson Road. Referred also to Clerk-Treasurer to examine ordinances governing placement of mobile homes.

Tom McChesney explained his progress in making some contacts in his Mill organization to get some answers on incineration of their waste product along with the City garbage.

A discussion was held on the Landfill situation, each Councilman giving his own opinion on entering into a contract with Sanitary Disposal, Inc. by the deadline of June 15, 1984. The general consensus was that this was just not enough time and not enough facts were known to make the commitment now. Motion made by Koskey, seconded by Tonnancour not to enter into a contract with Sanitary Disposal, Inc. at this time. Roll call vote. Carried 6 ayes, 2 absent.

Motion by Ellis, seconded by Koskey to readopt the Charter Ordinance 84-4 that provides for election-at-large of the aldermen of the City of Cornell to correct the typographical error on 83-10. Carried 6 ayes, 2 absent.

Ellis recommended to remove subsection (15) of the Police Rules & Regulations to take out the Clerk-Treasurers duties as authorized representative of the Police & Fire Commission, Public Safety and Health Committee and the Common Council. Council agreed.

Motion by Ellis, seconded by Gavitt to accept transfer of liquor application & License from Leisureland Foods, Inc. to Ladysmith IGA, Inc. Carried 6 ayes, 2 absent.

Motion by Ellis, seconded by Tonnancour to renew contract with Boardman, Suhr, Curry and Field and to designate Mayor Harold Ploof authorizing agent. Carried 7 ayes, 1 absent.

Council agreed that Utilities Commission take the rules pertaining to delinquent bills and credit risks to their committee and then make recommendations to the Council.

The Council agreed not to appoint an electrical inspector because of the cost involved.

Motion by Tonnancour, seconded by Gingras to investigate possibility of separating the Utility accounts by January 1985. Carried 7 ayes, 1 absent.

Bills totaling \$78,687.64 were read. CDBG bills totaling \$25,737.61 were read. Motion by Gingras, seconded by Tonnancour to accept bills as read. Carried 7 ayes, 1 absent.

Ellis referred to Planning Commission about sump pumps and the running of water on other property owners premises.

Ellis reported on City Works meeting of May 23 and June 6, 1984. Council agreed to continue having fill hauled down to millyard park. Motion by Ellis, seconded by Koskey to purchase a vibratory roller for \$9,221.00 for the Street Department. Carried 6 ayes, 2 absent. It was decided to have a Public Hearing on June
