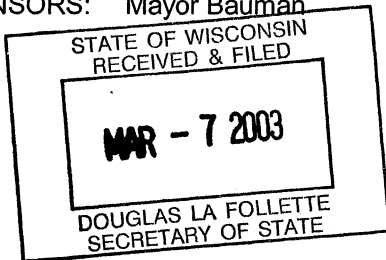

Fiscal Note: The total additional annualized cost for the term beginning April, 2003 is \$7,456. Salary increases are: Mayor - \$3,456; Alder - \$197 (\$197 x 18 alders = \$3,546); Council President - \$263; President Pro Tem - \$221. Funding for 2003 is included in the 2003 Adopted Operating Budget.

ANALYSIS: This amendment continues the practice of extending the sunset provision relating to increases of salaries for the mayor and alderpersons, including the president and president pro tem.

Pursuant to sec. 66.0101 Wis. Stats, 1999-2000, Section 3.29 entitled "Salaries of Mayor and Officials" of the Charter of the City of Madison is amended to read as follows:

**3.29 SALARIES OF MAYOR AND OFFICIALS.** Pursuant to the provisions of Section 62.09(6), Wis. Stats., the salaries of City officers are hereby fixed at the rates hereafter indicated and shall not be increased or diminished during the term for which said officers are elected or appointed:

	Annual Salary
Members of the Board of Public Works, including the Alderperson and City Engineer, per year	\$100.00
Members of the Board of Public Works, excluding the Alderperson and City Engineer, per year	\$20.00
Alderpersons, to be effective after the first regular meeting of the Common Council after the 1995 Spring election term that begins April 15, 2003, the Alderpersons' salaries, except for that of President and President Pro Tem of the Common Council, shall be

~~\$5,292.00.~~ 6,771. Such salaries shall annually be adjusted by a percentage equal to the average percentage of the adjustments granted to the City's recognized bargaining units whose contracts expired two years preceding the year of adjustment, rounded to the nearest whole percentage effective the ~~second~~ pay period in April. However, such annual adjustments to salaries shall terminate at the end of the terms of Alderpersons in ~~2003~~ 2005.

Mayor:

Effective the ~~first pay period after April 22, 1995~~ term that begins April 15, 2003, the Mayor's salary shall be ~~\$73,363.00~~ 101,324. Thereafter, that amount shall be adjusted by a percentage equal to the resultant percentages calculated four years previously for managerial employees pursuant to Section 3.38(6)(c)4., rounded to the nearest whole percentage, and shall be effective the ~~first second~~ pay period ~~after April 22~~ in April of each year of the mayoral term. Such annual salary adjustments shall terminate at the end of the mayoral term in ~~2003~~ 2007. The Mayor shall accrue vacation as provided in Section 3.36(7) of these ordinances. In addition to this salary, the benefit provided for in Section 3.38(~~27~~) (28) of these ordinances shall be afforded to qualifying Mayors.

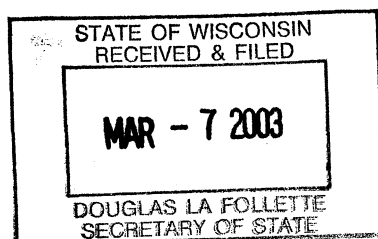
President of the Common Council:

Effective the ~~first pay period after the first regular meeting of the Common Council after the 1995 Spring election~~ term that begins April 15, 2003, the President's salary shall be ~~\$7,048.00~~ 9,017. Such salary shall annually be adjusted by a percentage equal to the average percentage of the adjustments granted to the City's recognized bargaining units whose contracts expired two years preceding the year of adjustment, rounded to the nearest whole percentage effective the ~~second~~ pay period in April. However, such annual adjustments to salary shall terminate at the end of the terms of Alderpersons in ~~2003~~ 2005.

President Pro Tem of the Common Council:

Effective the ~~first pay period after the first regular meeting of the Common Council after the 1995 Spring election~~ term that begins April 15, 2003, the President Pro Tem's salary shall be ~~\$5,934.00~~ 7,588.00. Such salary shall annually be adjusted by a percentage equal to the average percentage of the adjustments granted to the City's recognized bargaining units whose contracts expired two years preceding the year of adjustment, rounded to the nearest whole percentage effective the ~~second~~ pay period in April. However, such annual adjustments to salary shall terminate at the end of the terms of Alderpersons in ~~2003~~ 2005."

This is a Charter Ordinance which requires adoption by two-thirds of all the members of the Common Council and which will take effect 60 days after passage and publication, subject to the referendum provisions of sec. 62.0101(5), Wis. Stats., 1999-2000.
