SECTION 2. The town clerk of Fitchburg is hereby ^{Ibid. to district No. 6.} required to apportion money to district number 6, of said town, in the same manner as those districts which have maintained a school taught by a qualified teacher, for three months during the year ending August 31, 1866.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 219.

[Published April 8, 1867.]

AN ACT to change the boundary lines of the town of Kewaunee, Casco and Montpelier, in Kewaunee county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections three (3,) four (4,) five (5,) ^{Detached from Coryville and attached to Kewaunee.} eight (8,) nine (9,) ten (10,) fifteen (15,) sixteen (16,) seventeen (17,) twenty (20,) twenty-one (21,) twenty-two (22,) twenty-seven (27,) twenty-eight (28,) twenty-nine (29,) thirty-two (32,) thirty-three (33,) thirty-four (34,) and west half of sections two (2,) eleven (11,) fourteen (14,) twenty-three (23,) twenty-six (26) and thirty-five (35,) in township twenty-three (23,) of range twenty-four (24) east, in Kewaunee county are hereby detached from the town of Coryville, and attached to the town of Kewaunee, for all purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 2. Sections six (6,) seven (7,) eighteen (18,) nineteen (19,) thirty (30) and thirty-one (31,) in township twenty-three (23,) of range twenty-four (24) east, in Kewaunee county, are hereby detached from the town of Coryville, and attached to the town of Montpelier, for all purposes whatsoever. ^{Detached from Coryville and attached to Montpelier.}

SECTION 3. Sections thirty-one (31,) thirty-two (32,) thirty-three (33) and thirty-four (34,) in township twenty-four (24,) of range twenty-four (24) east, in Kewaunee county, are hereby detached from the town ^{Detached from Coryville and attached to Casco.}

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of Coryville, and attached to the town of Casco, for all purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of April, 1867.

CHAPTER 220.

[Published April 8, 1867.]

AN ACT to authorize the town of Dale, in the county of Outagamie, to return to volunteers the amount of bounty taxes paid by them.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Bounty taxes may be refunded to volunteers.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the voters of the town of Dale, in the county of Outagamie, at any annual town meeting, to authorize and fully empower the treasurer or supervisors of said town to pay back to all persons who were in the volunteer service from said town during the late war, and were honorably discharged from such service, the amount of bounty tax paid by them while in such service; said amount to be paid either in money, town or county orders, as the said town may direct.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
