

ORDINANCE NO. 2002-06

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE VILLAGE OF KEWASKUM, WISCONSIN

The Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>Territory Annexed</u>. In accordance with s. 66.021 of the Wisconsin Statutes and the petition for direct annexation filed with the village clerk on the 28th day of March, 2002, signed by the owner of the parcel being petitioned for annexation. The following described territory is in the Town of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, is annexed to the Village of Kewaskum, Wisconsin.

Description of Premises

Section 16:

Part of the S½ of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 and part of Section 16, Township 12 North, Range 19 East, Town of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin.

Commencing at the East quarter corner of said Section 16; thence N 00 degrees 18 minutes 41 seconds E, along the east line of said NE 1/4, 600 feet, to the point of beginning of lands herein described; thence N 89 degrees 41 minutes 19 seconds W, 352.91 feet; thence N 00 degrees 18 minutes 41 seconds E, 50.00 feet; thence N 89 degrees 02 minutes 41 seconds E, 353.00 feet, to a point in said east line of the NE 1/4; thence S 00 degrees 18 minutes 41 seconds W, along said east line, 57.80 feet to the point of beginning.

Containing 0.437 acres (19,021 square feet) more or less.

SECTION 2. <u>Effect of Annexation</u>. From and after the date of this ordinance the territory described in section 1 shall be a part of the Village of Kewaskum for any and all purposes provided by law and all persons coming or residing within such territory shall be subject to all ordinances, rules and regulations governing the Village of Kewaskum.

SECTION 3. <u>Temporary/Permanent Zoning Classification</u>. (a) Upon recommendation of the plan commission, the territory annexed to the Village of Kewaskum by this ordinance is temporarily/permanently zoned as follows, pursuant to sec. 66.021(7)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes:

B-2 General Retail and Service District NOTE: Portions of designations may include some Conservancy, Flood plain, Shoreland, and Wetland areas.)

(b) The Plan Commission on April 30, 2002 recommended the permanent zoning classification of B-2 General Retail and Service District on the single parcel of land being

annexed. It was further noted within designation there may be some Flood plain, Shoreland, and Wetland areas.

SECTION 4. <u>Ward Designation</u>. (a) The territory described in section 1 of this ordinance is hereby made a part of the 4th ward of the Village of Kewaskum, subject to the ordinances, rules and regulations of the Village governing wards.

(b) Be it further noted as per the petition for annexation submitted by Robert and Victoria Hackbarth land owners, Town of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin indicated the population of the noted area is 0 and the number of electors is 0.

SECTION 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, or if the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstances is invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application.

SECTION 6. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.



That there are no electors residing in the territory above described.


That the territory to be annexed is approximately .437 acres.

Village Board Meeting Minutes

Mid Monthly Meeting May 20, 2002 8:00 p.m.

The Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in Regular Session in the Council room of the Municipal Building, 204 First Street.

President John D. Kenworthy presided. All Trustee Members were present. A quorum was present.

The meeting was opened with a Moment of Silence and the Pledge of Allegiance.

On a motion by Trustee Thomas Piwoni, seconded by Trustee Robert Stoltzmann and unanimously carried by voice vote, the minutes of the May 6, 2002 were approved as printed.

Fire Chief Mark Groeschel was absent and did not have anything for the Board.

Police Chief Richard Knoebel presented the Annual report of the Kewaskum Police Department for 2001:

- 1. Total index crimes, those reported to the State on a monthly basis, increased 11.1 % in 2001.
- 2. During 2001, all crime rates in Kewaskum were considerably lower than those of the entire state and slightly higher than comparable communities.
- 3. During 2001, 25 of 100 or 25% of reported index crimes were cleared by arrest. The 2001 clearance rate is lower than the 2000 clearance rate of 28.9%. It is comparable to the statewide clearance rate of 24.9%.
- Total adult arrests increased by 16.8% from 273 in 2000 to 319 in 2001.
- 5. Total juvenile arrests decreased by 20%, from 230 in 2000 to 184 in 2001.
- 6. The property recovery rate for Kewaskum of 18% is less than its 2000 recovery rate of 37.5%. However, the amount of property stolen was 62.7% higher than 2000.
- 7. There was a total of 370 traffic citations issued in 2001, while there were a total of 1,115 traffic warnings given during the same period. That is one citation issued for approximately every four vehicles stopped by the Kewaskum Police Department.
- 8. The Kewaskum Police Department handled 1,725 complaints in 2001 compared to 2,115 in
- 9. The Kewaskum Police Department patrolled a total of 67,541 miles in 2001.

The Board asked several questions of the Police Chief and discussed the school liaison officer program. The Board also expressed their thanks to the Police Clerk for a job well done on the Annual Report.

Director of Public Works Jerry Gilles reviewed the following:

- 1. The Board was informed that the concrete work at the KKCP bathroom was in the process of being replaced.
- 2. The storm sewer/catch basin work previously discussed is also being fixed and the new curb and gutter concrete work is being completed.

Administrator Daniel S. Schmidt reviewed the following with the Board:

- 1) Review League and Taxpayer bulletins.
- 2) Reported on the Board of Review meeting of May 13, 2002. It was noted that no one appeared before the Board and that the assessed value of the Village has increased \$4,472,700 or 3.6% and that the total assessed value without manufacturing is at \$128,057,300.
 - 3) Review building permit report

for April 2002, noting that permits are ahead of 2001.

4) Review of correspondence.

Trustee Mathew Heiser, Chairman of the Park & Recreation Committee report on the request for closing the RHP the day prior to the area youth fishing day. On a motion by Trustee Larry Ammel, seconded by Trustee Thomas Piwoni and unanimously carried by voice vote, the Board authorized the closing of River Hill Park to fishing from May 31, 2002 noon to Saturday June 1, 2002 9:00 a.m.

Board representative for the Plan Commission, Trustee Andy Pesch announced a scheduled meeting for Tuesday, May 28, 2002 at 7:00 p.m.

Board Representative of the Library Board, Trustee Mathew Heiser indicated that the May report will be given at a future meeting.

Mid Moraine Municipal Association Legislative Committee Board Representative, Trustee Robert Stoltzmann reported that the committee met on Wednesday, May 8, 2002 at 7:00 p.m. The topic was again the States budget problems.

Discussion was held on the recommendation from the Board of Review regarding the approval of a contract to complete the Revaluation and Assessors Contract for 2003 as mandated by the state. It was noted the current village assessor, Bowmar Appraisal, prepared a proposal and that the funds for said work have been budgeted. On a motion by Trustee Robert Stoltzmann, seconded by Trustee Larry Ammel and unanimously carried by voice vote the Board authorized signing the contract for said revaluation and contract work for 2003 at a cost of **\$43,600**.

On a motion by Trustee Andy Pesch, seconded by Trustee Mathew Heiser and unanimously carried by voice vote, the Board approved the Special Assessment Letter Policy, which would take affect on July 1, 2002 increasing that charge to \$20.00 and provide for rush fee of \$30.00.

The Board reviewed the open-air shelter plans as provided by the Kewaskum Athletic Association. On a motion by Trustee Larry Ammel, seconded by Trustee Thomas Piwoni and unanimously carried by voice vote the Board authorized the construction and donation of said work and material.

On a motion by Trustee Mathew Heiser, seconded by Trustee Larry Ammel and unanimously carried by voice vote the Board cancelled the July 1, 2002 Village Board meeting due to the 4th of July Celebration and indicated that July 15, 2002 will be the only meeting held in July 2002.

President John Kenworthy thanked the High School Student in attendance for coming and invited them back as well as asking them if they had any questions.

Motion by Trustee Robert Stoltzmann, seconded by Trustee Thomas Piwoni and carried by the majority roll call vote, to adjourn. Roll call vote was 7 Aye 0 Nay 0 Absent.

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
