AN ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Wausau do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Territory Annexed. In accordance with Chapter 66, Wisconsin Statutes, and the petition for direct annexation signed by Joseph J. Swiderski, Trustee of the Joseph J. Swiderski Family Trust Dated June 6, 2002, sole owner of the land now located in the Town of Stettin, Marathon County, Wisconsin, and being a part of the Wausau School District, there being no electors residing therein, the following described land is hereby annexed to the City of Wausau:

Part of the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4, Section 29, Township 29 North, Range 7 East, Town of Stettin, Marathon County, Wisconsin, described as follows:

Lot 1 of Certified Survey Map No. 8779 recorded in the Office of Register of Deeds for Marathon County in Volume 34 of Certified Survey Maps on page 157.

Section 2. Effect of Annexation. From and after the date of publication of this ordinance, the territory described in Section 1 shall be a part of the City of Wausau and remain a part of the Wausau School District for any and all purposes provided by law, and all persons coming or residing within such territory shall be subject to all ordinances, rules and regulations governing the City of Wausau, and governing the School District.

Section 3. Zoning Classifications. Zoning of the within real estate shall be pursuant to Section 23.04.020, Zoning of Annexed Lands, of the Wausau Municipal Code.

Section 4. Aldermanic District. The territory described in Section 1 of this ordinance is hereby made a part of the 9th Aldermanic District and the 41st Ward of the City of Wausau, subject to the ordinances, rules and regulations of the city, county, and state, governing districts.

<u>Section 5</u>. The State of Wisconsin, Department of Administration, has favorably reviewed the annexation and found it not to be against the public interest.

<u>Section 6</u>. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, or if the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.


