

ORDINANCE NO. A62
ORDINANCE OF DIRECT ANNEXATION BY UNANIMOUS APPROVAL

THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF CASHTON, MONROE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 66.021(12), Wis. Stats., a petition for direct annexation signed by all of the electors residing in and the owners of all real property in the territory described below has been filed with the City Clerk and with the Town Clerk of the town of Portland in which such territory is located, together with a scale map and description of the property to be annexed showing boundaries of such territory and the relationship of the territory to the municipalities, and a copy of such petition, map and description of the territory was mailed to the Department of Development within five days after filing, the advice of the department having been reviewed by the Common Council.

Section 2. The following described territory located in Monroe County, Wisconsin is hereby annexed to the Village of Cashton, Monroe County, Wisconsin, to-wit:

A parcel of land located in the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ -NE $\frac{1}{4}$) described as follows:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of the Northeast one quarter, (NE $\frac{1}{4}$), of said Section 36, a Harrison Monument; thence N89°40'23"W 2655.22 feet along the North line of said Northeast one quarter, (NE $\frac{1}{4}$), to a Harrison Monument; thence S22°36'43"E 1295.63 feet to a 3/4 inch iron rebar set on the East Right of Way line of Wisconsin State Trunk Highway No. 27, the point of beginning; thence S35°04'41"W 238.87 feet along said Easterly Right of Way line to a 3/4 inch iron rebar; thence S 22°10'02"W 297.12 feet along said Easterly Right of Way line to the Easterly Right of Way line of the abandoned Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad, a 3/4 inch iron rebar; thence along said Easterly Right of Way line of said abandoned Railroad along a curve concave to the Southeast, with a central angle of 13°02'18", a radius of 1382.69 feet, an arc length of 314.65, and a chord bearing of N46°49'56"E 313.97 feet, to a 3/4 inch iron rebar; thence N53°21'04"E 189.12 feet along said Easterly abandoned Railroad Right of Way line, to a 3/4 inch iron rebar; thence N42°34'28"W 194.13 feet to the point of beginning.

Said parcel is subject to all recorded easements and contains 51420 square feet or 1.180 acres.

Section 3. The territory annexed by this ordinance shall be temporarily designated as agricultural for zoning purposes under the Village of Cashton's zoning code, and shall be part of the Village of Cashton.

Section 4. The Village Clerk shall file immediately with the Secretary of State a certified copy of this ordinance, the certificate and plat and one copy to each company that provides any utility service in the area annexed plus one such copy with the Register of Deeds and one copy with the clerk of the Cashton Area School District, signed by the Village Clerk, describing the territory which was annexed and the associated population, all pursuant to Section 66.021(8), Wis. Stats.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect following its enactment by a two-thirds vote of the supervisors of the governing body of the Village of Cashton.
